WESLEYAN CHURCH GRANTS.

THE descriptions of the following portions of Land, which have been appropriated to the Wesleyan Church, are published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of each will be executed in favor of the approved Trustees, viz. :—

54. KIAMA, 1, One acre, county of Camden, parish of Kiama, allotments Nos. 10 and 11 of section 4; bounded on the west by Manning-street, being a line bearing south 27 degrees, west 3 chains; on the south by Bong Bong-street, being a line bearing east 27 degrees, south 2 chains 50 links; on the east by allotment No. 12, being a line bearing north 27 degrees, east 2 chains; again on the south by that allotment, being a line bearing east 27 degrees, south 2 chains 50 links; again on the east by allotment No. 15, being a line bearing north 27 degrees, east 1 chain; and on the north by allotment No. 9, being a line bearing west 27 degrees, north 5 chains.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

55. KIAMA, 2r., Two roods, county of Camden, parish of Kiama, allotment No. 20 of section 17; commencing at the west corner of allotment No. 1, and bounded on the south-east by a line bearing north 27 degrees, east 2 chains, dividing it from

that allotment; on the north-east by a line bearing west 27 degrees, north 2 chains 50 links; on the north-west by a line bearing south 27 degrees, west 2 chains to Minumurra-street; and on the south-west by that street, bearing east 27 degrees, south 2 chains 50 links to the point of commencement.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

56. KIAMA, 2r., Two roods, county of Camden, parish of Kiama, allotment No. 1 of section 17; commencing at the north intersection of Minumurra and Shoalhaven-streets, and bounded on the south-east by Shoalhaven-street, bearing north 27 degrees, east 2 chains; on the north-east by a line bearing west 27 degrees, north 2 chains 50 links; on the north-west by a line bearing south 27 degrees, west 2 chains to Minumurra-street; and on the south-west by that street, bearing east 27 degrees, south 2 chains 50 links to the point of commencement.

MURRURUNDI, 1, One acre, county of Brisbane, parish of Murrurundi, allotments Nos. 1 and 2 of section 7; bounded on the south-east by Mount-street, commencing at the west intersection of Mount and Little-streets, bearing south 24 degrees, west 5 chains; on the south-west by a line bearing north 66 degrees, west 2 chains; on the north-west by a line bearing north 24 degrees, east 5 chains to Little-street; and on the north-east by Little-street, bearing south 66 degrees, east 2 chains to the point of commencement.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

58. MURRURUNDI, 2r., Two roods, county of Brisbane, parish of Murrurundi, allotment No. 3 of section 7; bounded on the south-east by the Wesleyan Chapel appropriation 5 chains; on the south-west by the north-east boundary of allotment No. 18, 1 chain; on the north-west by a line bearing north 24 degrees, east 5 chains to Little-street; and on the north-east by Little-street, bearing south 66 degrees, east 1 chain to the said Wesleyan Chapel appropriation. Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

59. MURRURUNDI, 2r., Two roods, county of Brisbane, parish of Murrurundi, allotment No. 4 of section 7; bounded on the south-east by the north-west boundary of allotment No. 3, 5 chains; on the south-west by the north-east boundary of allotment No. 17, 1 chain; on the north-west by a line bearing north 24 degrees, east 5 chains to Little-street; and on the north-east by Little-street, bearing south 66 degrees, east 1 chain to allotment No. 3 aforesaid. Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

60. SCONE, 1, One acre, county of Brisbane, parish of Scone, allotments Nos. 15 and 16 of section 16, commencing 4 chains south from the north-west corner of section 16; bounded on the west by Guernsey-street, being a line bearing south 2 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 5 chains; on the east by a line bearing north 2 chains; and on the north by a line bearing west 5 chains to the point of commencement. Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

61. SCONE, 2r., Two roods, county of Brisbane, parish of Scone, allotment No. 17 of section 16, commencing 6 chains south from the north-west corner of section 16; bounded on the west by Guernsey-street, being a line 1 chain south; on the south by a line 5 chains east; on the east by a line 1 chain north; and on the north by a line 5 chains west to the point of commencement. Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

62. SCONE, 2r., Two roods, county of Brisbane, parish of Scone, allotment No. 18 of section 16; commencing 7 chains south from the north-west corner of section 16, bounded on the west by Guernsey-street, being a line 1 chain south; on the south by a line 5 chains east; on the east by a line 1 chain north; and on the north by a line 5 chains west to the point of commencement. Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

63. UPPER PICTON, 1, One acre, county of Camden, parish of Picton, allotments Nos. 9 and 10 of section 2; commencing at the south-west intersection of Antill and Argyle-streets, and bounded on the north by Antill-street, bearing west 7 degrees, north 5 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 7 degrees, west 2 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 7 degrees, south 5 chains to Argyle-street; and on the east by Argyle-street, bearing north 7 degrees, east 2 chains to the point of commencement. Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

64. UPPER PICTON, 2r., Two roods, county of Camden, parish of Picton, allotment No. 11 of section 2; commencing at the north-west corner of allotment No. 10, and bounded on the north by

Antill-street, bearing west 7 degrees, north 1 chain; on the west by a line bearing south 7 degrees, west 5 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 7 degrees, south 1 chain; and on the east by a line bearing north 7 degrees, east 5 chains to the point of commencement.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

65. UPPER PICTON, 2r., Two roods, county of Camden, parish of Picton, allotment No. 12 of section 2; commencing at the north-west corner of allotment No. 11, and bounded on the north by Antill-street, bearing west 7 degrees, north 1 chain; on the west by a line bearing south 7 degrees, west 5 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 7 degrees, south 1 chain; and on the east by a line bearing north 7 degrees, east 5 chains to the point of commencement.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

66. MUSWELLBROOK, 1, One acre, county of Durham, parish of Rowan; commencing at the north-east corner of the Church of England Church allotment, and bounded on the east by Hunter Terrace, bearing north 5 chains to Hill-street; on the north by Hill-street, bearing west 2 chains; on the west by a line bearing south 5 chains to the Church of England Church allotment; and on the south by the said Church allotment, bearing east to the commencing corner.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

67. MUSWELLBROOK, 2r., Two roods, county of Durham, parish of Rowan; bounded on the east by the Wesleyan Chapel allotment, bearing north 5 chains; on the north by Hill-street, bearing west 1 chain; on the west by a line bearing south 5 chains to the Church of England parsonage allotment; and on the south by the said parsonage allotment, bearing east 1 chain.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

68. MUSWELLBROOK, 2r., Two roods, county of Durham, parish of Rowan; bounded on the east by the Wesleyan School allotment, bearing north 5 chains; on the north by Hill-street, bearing west 1 chain; on the west by Church-lane, bearing south 5 chains to the Church of England School allotment; and on the south by the said School allotment, bearing east 1 chain.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

69. ORANGE, 1, One acre, county of Wellington, parish of Orange, allotments Nos. 2 and 3 of section 7; commencing at the north-east corner of allotment No. 1, and bounded on the south by a line of 5 chains at right angles to Anson-street; on the west by a line of 2 chains parallel to Anson-street; on the north by a line of 5 chains at right angles to Anson-street; and on the east by 2 chains of Anson-street to the north-east corner of allotment No. 1 aforesaid.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

70. ORANGE, 2r., Two roods, county of Wellington, parish of Orange, allotment No. 4 of section 7; commencing at the north-east corner of allotment No. 3, and bounded on the south by a line of 5 chains at right angles to Anson-street; on the west by a line of 1 chain parallel to Anson-street; on the north by a line of 5 chains at right

angles to Anson-street; and on the east by a line of 1 chain of Anson-street to the north-east corner of allotment No. 3 aforesaid.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

71. ORANGE, 2r., Two roods, county of Wellington, parish of Orange, allotment No. 1 of section 7; commencing at the north-west corner of the intersection of Summer-street with Anson-street; and bounded on the south by 5 chains of Summer-street, bearing west; on the west by a line of 1 chain parallel to Anson-street; on the north by a line of 5 chains at right angles to Anson-street; and on the east by 1 chain of Anson-street, to the commencing point aforesaid.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

72. ABERDEEN, 1, One acre, county of Durham, parish of Russell, allotments Nos. 7 and 8 of section 2; bounded on the west by 2 chains of the east side of Abercainey Terrace, bearing north; on the north by a line dividing it from allotment No. 6, bearing east 5 chains; on the east by a line dividing it from allotments Nos. 13 and 14, (the Church of England School and Parsonage allotments,) bearing south 2 chains; and on the south by a line dividing it from allotment No. 9, bearing west 5 chains to Abercainey Terrace.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

73. ABERDEEN, 2r., Two roods, county of Durham, parish of Russell, allotment No. 9 of section 2; bounded on the west by 1 chain of the east side of Abercainey Terrace, bearing north; on the north by a line dividing it from allotment No. 8, bearing east 5 chains; on the east by 1 chain of the west boundary line of the Church of England Church allotment, bearing south; and on the south by a line dividing it from allotment No. 10, bearing west 5 chains to Abercainey Terrace.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

74. ABERDEEN, 2r., Two roods, county of Durham, parish of Russell, allotment No. 10 of section 2; bounded on the west by 1 chain of the east side of Abercainey Terrace, bearing north; on the north by a line dividing it from allotment No. 9, bearing east 5 chains; on the east by 1 chain of the west boundary line of the Church of England Church allotment, bearing south to Moray-street; and on the south by 5 chains of the north side of Moray-street, bearing west to Abercainey Terrace.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

75. RIVER LETT, 1, One acre, county of Cook, parish unnamed, near Hartley; commencing at the north extremity of the west boundary of the Wesleyan School allotment, and bounded on the west by that allotment, being a line bearing north 4 chains 50 links; on the north by Lockyer's line of road, being a line bearing east 31 degrees, south 4 chains 76 links; on the east by a line bearing south 1 chain; and on the south by the Wesleyan Minister's Dwelling and School allotments, being a line bearing west 4 chains to the commencing point.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Chapel.

76. RIVER LETT, 2r., Two roods, county of Cook, parish unnamed, near Hartley; commencing at a point bearing north-west from the north

extremity of the west boundary line of Field's 50 acres, and distant therefrom 9 chains 10 links, and bounded on the west by a line bearing north 2 chains 50 links; on the north by the Wesleyan Chapel allotment, being a line bearing east 2 chains; on the east by the Wesleyan Minister's Dwelling allotment, being a line bearing south 2 chains 50 links; and on the south by a line bearing west 2 chains to the commencing point.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan School House.

77. RIVER LETT, 2r., Two roods, county of Cook, parish unnamed, near Hartley; commencing at the south extremity of the east boundary of the Wesleyan School allotment, and bounded on the west by that allotment, being a line bearing north 2 chains 50 links; on the north by the Wesleyan Chapel allotment, being a line bearing east 2 chains; on the east by a line bearing south 2 chains 50 links; and on the south by a line bearing west 2 chains to the commencing point.

Authorised as the site for a Wesleyan Minister's Residence.

78. WILLIAM'S TOWN, 3r. 32p., Three roods and thirty-two perches, county of Grant, parish of Cut-paw-paw, allotments Nos. 10 and 11 of section 1; bounded on the north by a lane of 50 links wide, which separates it from allotment No. 9, bearing south 75 degrees, east 2 chains; on the east by allotment No. 12, bearing south 15 degrees, west 4 chains 75 links; on the south by Rodney-street, bearing north 75 degrees, west 2 chains; and on the west by Ann-street, bearing north 15 degrees, east 4 chains 75 links.

WILLIAM'S TOWN, 1r. 36p., One rood and thirty-six perches, county of Bourke, parish of Cut-paw-paw, allotment No. 12 of section 1; bounded on the west by allotments Nos. 10 and 11, bearing north 15 degrees, east 4 chains 75 links; on the north by a lane of 50 links wide, bearing south 75 degrees, east 1 chain; on the east by allotment No. 13, bearing south 15 degrees, west 4 chains 75 links; and on the south by Rodney-street, bearing north 75 degrees, west 1 chain.

WILLIAM'S TOWN, 1r. 36p., One rood and thirty-six perches, county of Bourke, parish of Cut-paw-paw, allotment No. 13 of section 1; bounded on the west by allotment No. 12, bearing north 15 degrees, east 4 chains 75 links; on the north by a lane of 50 links wide, bearing south 75 degrees, east 1 chain; on the east by allotment No. 14, bearing south 15 degrees, west 4 chains 75 links; and on the south by Rodney-street, bearing north 75 degrees, west 1 chain.
