PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers in me vested, by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the more effectual administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies,*" I did by my Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of December last, issued by and with the advice of the Executive Council, direct and appoint that a Circuit Court, for the trial of Criminal as well as Civil issues, should be holden at the Town of Geelong, in the District of Port Phillip, at the several times therein mentioned; and whereas it is expedient to fix the boundaries and limits of the Circuit District thereby established, now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to make further provision for the trial of cases in the Circuit Courts of New South Wales, and to amend in certain respects the Act providing for the trial by Jury in such Courts,*" do by this my Proclamation for that purpose issued, proclaim and appoint, that the aforesaid Geelong Circuit District, shall consist of all parts of the said District of Port Phillip within the said Colony, comprehended within

the Counties of Follet, Dundas, Villiers, Ripon, Hampden, Heytesbury, Polworth, and Grenville, according to the boundaries thereof respectively set forth in my Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, of the thirtieth December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight; and also within the Counties or reputed Counties of Grant and Normandy; and also all parts of the said District comprehended within the following boundary lines, that is to say, commencing at the source of the Avoca, near Mount Cole, to Lake Bael Bael; and thence in a line north to the Murray River; thence by the Murray River to the South Australian Boundary line; thence by the South Australian Boundary line to the Musquito Creek; thence by the northern boundary of the Counties Follet, Dundas, Villiers and Ripon, to the source of the Avoca aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this thirty-first day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS numerous Grants of Land which have been issued under the Great Seal of the Colony during the respective Reigns of their Majesties King George the Fourth, King William the Fourth, and Her Present Majesty Queen Victoria, contain reservations to their said Majesties respectively, and their Heirs and Successors, of all mines of Coal, with full and free liberty and power to search for, dig, and take away the same, and also the right of full and free ingress, egress, and regress, into, out of, and upon the said land for the purposes aforesaid; and whereas Her Present Majesty being desirous of promoting the welfare of her subjects, has been graciously pleased to direct that all such reservations and the rights incident thereto shall be abandoned: Now, know ye, that, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor aforesaid, do in pursuance of instructions in that behalf, received from one of Her Majesty's principal Secretaries of State proclaim and declare on behalf of Her said Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, that all and every the reservations and rights aforesaid are and is for ever abandoned and given up, and that the respective Grantees under the aforesaid Grants, and their respective Heirs and Assigns, now are and shall henceforth be at full liberty to dig and take away all Coal which may be in their respective lands, for their own use and benefit, with the exception alone of such lands as may be comprised within any City, Township, or Village.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-fourth day of January, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

POSTAGE.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct, that in future all letters whatsoever, addressed to the Departments and Officers of Government on the Public Service, and forwarded by Post, shall be pre-paid, otherwise it will be necessary to refuse them with a view to their being returned to the writers, who, under the 22nd clause of the Act of the Governor and Council, 13 Victoria, No. 38, will be liable to pay the Postage thereon.

2. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of Clergymen or persons not in the Public Service, who may have occasion to send in Returns to any Department of Government of an entirely public nature; such for instance, as the Returns of Births, Marriages, and Burials; but the nature of the Return must, in all such cases, be endorsed on the cover in which it is enclosed.

3. To reduce the cost of Postage to individuals having occasion to make remittances to the Colonial Treasury or any other Public Department, all sums under one pound, should be remitted in Postage stamps of the equivalent value, for which credit will be given as cash.
