PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS in pursuance of the powers in me vested, by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled," An Act to provide for the more effectual "administration of Justice in New South Wales "and its Dependencies," I did by my Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of November last, issued by and with the advice of the Executive Council, direct and appoint that a Circuit Court, for the trial of Criminal as well as Civil issues, should be holden at the Town of Brisbane, at the several times therein mentioned; and whereas it is $\epsilon \mathbf{x}$ pedient to fix the boundaries and limits of the Circuit District thereby established,-Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to "make further provision for the trial of cases in " the Circuit Courts of New South Wales, and to " amend in certain respects the Act providing for " the trial by Jury in such Courts," do by this my Proclamation for that purpose issued, proclaim and

appoint, that the aforesaid Brisbane Circuit District, shall consist of all parts of the said Colony, comprehended within the County or reputed County of Stanley, as described in a certain Proclamation issued under the hand and seal of the Governor for the time being of the said Colony, bearing date the twentyseventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and published in the New South Wales Government Gazette of the twenty-eighth day of the said month of February; and also all parts of the said Colony comprehended within the Districts or reputed Districts known as the Crown Commissioners' Districts of Maranoa, Darling Downs, Burnett, Wide Bay, and Moreton, according to the boundaries thereof respectively set forth in my Proclamation bearing date the third day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and published in the New South Wales Government Gazette of the seventh day of the said month of November.

2. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of Clergymen or persons not in the Public Service, who may have occasion to send in Returns to any Department of Government of an entirely public nature; such for instance, as the Returns of Births, Marriages, and Burials, but the nature of the Return must, in all such cases, be endorsed on the cover in which it is enclosed.

3. To reduce the cost of Postage to individuals having occasion to make remittances to the Colonial Treasury or any other Public Department, all sums under one pound, should be remitted in Postage stamps of the equivalent value, for which credit will be given as cash.
