IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies.*" I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Wednesday, the 20th day of March next, the following portions of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, at the Police Office, Goulburn, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act. (Deposit 10 per cent.)

## COUNTRY LOTS.

1. GEORGIANA, 50, Fifty acres, parish unnamed, at the junction of Oakoy Creek with the Lachlan or Fish River, opposite the Village Reserve at Graham's Creek; commencing at a large marked leaning gum tree on the east bank of the Lachlan or Fish River, which bears north 51 degrees 10 minutes, east 9 chains from the gum tree at the north-east corner of J. Jamieson's, Junior, 782 acres purchase on that river; and bounded on the south in part by the northern boundary of a measured portion of 30 acres, being a line bearing
