### FERRY ACROSS THE SNOWY RIVER, AT JANMINGEE.

**T**HE Dues arising from the Ferry over the Snowy River, at Janmingee, will be put up to auction, by the Clerk of Petty Sessions of Bombala, at the Police Office, Bombala, on Wednesday, the 23rd proximo, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of February, 1850.
