HEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the twenty-sixth day of March instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested, as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the thirtieth day of April now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this eleventh day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
