WALLAMBINE COMMON.

THE description of the undermentioned portion of Land, near the Macdonald River, promised by Sir Thomas Brisbane as a Common for the use of the inhabitants of the districts of the Wollombi and Macdonald River, is published for general information.

At the expiration of one month from this date, the Deed of Grant of the said Common will be executed in favor of Trustees appointed by His Excellency the Governor, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 11 Victoria, No. 31, intituled, "*An Act to enable Trustees of Commons in New South Wales to have perpetual succession, and to empower them to regulate the use of such lands as may be granted as Commons, within the said Colony; and for other purposes relating thereto,*" viz. :—

1. County of Northumberland, parish unnamed, near the Macdonald River, 2565 acres, Wallambine Common; commencing at the north-east corner of J. Hall's 70 acres; and bounded partly on the south by that land, being a line bearing west 30 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 220 chains; then on the south by a line bearing west 32 chains; from thence on the west by a line bearing north 51 chains; again on the south by a line bearing west 17 chains; then on the west by a line bearing north 21 chains; then on the south by a line bearing west 52 chains; then on the west by a line bearing north 20 chains; from thence on the south by a line bearing east 52 chains; then on the east by a line bearing south 20 chains; then on the north by a line bearing east 39 chains; then on the east by a line bearing south 40 chains; then on the north by a line bearing east 10 chains to the north-east corner of the Broad Arm; from thence on the west by a line bearing north 107 chains; then on the north by a line bearing east 60 chains; then on the east by a line bearing south 395 chains; again on the south by a line bearing west 30 chains; and from thence on the west by J. Hall's 70 acres, being a line bearing north 35 chains to the north-east corner of J. Hall's 70 acres as aforesaid.

POSTAGE.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct, that in future all letters whatsoever addressed to the Departments and Officers of Government on the Public Service, and forwarded by Post, shall be pre-paid, otherwise it will be necessary to refuse them with a view to

the 22nd clause of the Act of the Governor and Council, 13 Victoria, No. 38, will be liable to pay the Postage thereon.

2. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of Clergymen or persons *not* in the Public Service, who may have occasion to send in Returns to any Department of Government of an entirely public nature; such for instance, as the Returns of Births, Marriages, and Burials, but the nature of the Return must, in all such cases, be endorsed on the cover in which it is enclosed.

3. To reduce the cost of Postage to individuals having occasion to make remittances to the Colonial Treasury or any other Public Department, all sums under one pound, should be remitted in Postage stamps of the equivalent value, for which credit will be given as cash.

**FERRY ACROSS THE SNOWY RIVER,
AT JANMINGEE.**

THE Dues arising from the Ferry over the Snowy River, at Janmingee, will be put up to auction, by the Clerk of Petty Sessions of Bombala, at the Police Office, Bombala, on Wednesday, the 23rd proximo, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of February, 1850.
