PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation, publicly notify and declare, that Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen has been pleased by the Order in Council hereto annexed, to make and establish the additional Rules and Regulations therein contained, for regulating the occupation of Waste Lands of the Crown in the Colony of New South Wales.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament holden in the ninth and tenth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act for regulating the sale of the Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof,*" after reciting that it might be expedient that various rules and regulations should be made respecting certain matters therein specified, and, among the rest, respecting the more effectually making Demises or Licenses of such Waste Land as aforesaid, and respecting the insertion in such Demises or Licenses of such conditions and clauses of forfeiture as therein mentioned, and respecting any other matters which might be requisite, either for carrying into more complete effect the occupa-

tion of such Waste Lands, or for preventing the abuses incident thereto, it was enacted, That it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order in Council, to make and establish all such rules and regulations as to Her Majesty should seem meet, for the purpose so specified, or for any of them; and any such rules and regulations again to repeal, renew, alter, and amend; and that all such Orders in Council should have the force and effect of law in the said Australian Colonies.

And whereas by an Order in Council, made on the ninth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Act, it was ordered, that it should be lawful for the Governor, or officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of New South Wales, to grant Leases of Land for pastoral purposes, (hereinafter described as pastoral leases,) in such manner, and subject to such restrictions as are therein described.

And whereas it is expedient that all such pastoral leases should contain such conditions, clauses of forfeiture, exceptions, and reservations, as may be necessary for securing the peaceable and effectual occupation of the lands comprised in such leases, and for preventing the abuses and inconveniences incident thereto: It is hereby ordered, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that it shall be lawful for the Governor for the time being, or for the Officer for the time being administering the Government of the aforesaid Colony, to insert in any pastoral lease hereafter to be made, such conditions and clauses of forfeiture, exceptions, or reservations, as to him shall seem requisite for the purposes last aforesaid; and that any condition, clause of forfeiture, exception, or reservation, which may be endorsed on any pastoral lease, after the execution thereof, and signed by the lessee, his executor, administrator, or assign, and by the Governor or Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, shall be as effectual, to all intents and purposes, as if it had been inserted in the body of such lease, in pursuance of the powers given by this Order.

Provided always, that no such condition or clause of forfeiture, exception, or reservation, shall entitle any person, other than the holder of such lease, to use the lands comprised therein for the purpose of pasture or cultivation.

And it is further ordered, that all pastoral leases shall be transferable, under such conditions, and in such manner and form as shall be determined by the Governor or Officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony.

And it is further ordered, that this Order in Council shall be of no effect until it shall have been proclaimed in the Colony of New South Wales, by the Governor or Officer administering the Government, thereof.

And the Right Honorable Earl Grey, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

STREETS.—SYDNEY.

WITH reference to the Government Notice dated 31st May, 1849, relative to the opening and making of certain Streets, and continuations of Streets, in the southern parts of the City of Sydney: Notice is hereby given, in conformity with the Act of Council 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof;*" that no objections having been made to the lines of the parts of Albion-street, and of Elizabeth-street, and of Devonshire and Cooper-street, as above notified, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, to confirm the same; and it is, therefore, hereby declared expedient to open and make the Streets, and portions of Streets, therein referred to, according to the Map or Plan thereof respectively, to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General; and all persons intending to claim compensation, in respect of the said lines, are hereby reminded that notice must be served upon the Colonial Secretary *within forty days* from the date hereof, in such manner and forms as are prescribed by the sixth and thirty-second sections of the Act above referred to, or they will for ever be foreclosed from such claim.

GRANT OF LAND TO THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF SYDNEY.

SYDNEY, 3r. 28p., Three roods and twenty-eight perches, county of Cumberland, parish of St. James; commencing at the intersection of Bridge-street with Phillip-street, and bounded on the north by the building line of Bridge-street, westerly 2 chains 92½ links to its intersection with Elizabeth-street; on the west by the building line of Elizabeth-street, southerly 3 chains 8 links; on the south by a line at right-angles, easterly 2 chains 68½ links to Phillip-street; and on the east by the building line of Phillip-street, northerly 3 chains 63 links to its intersection with Bridge-street aforesaid.

SIR,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 164, of the 4th of August last, transmitting copy of a Memorial addressed to you by the Retired Military, Naval, and Medical Officers in Her Majesty's and the East India Company's Services, resident in New South Wales, praying to be allowed the benefit of the Regulations enclosed in my Circular Despatch of the 18th of August, 1848, under which increased privileges were allowed to Military and Naval Officers in the purchase of Land in the Colonies therein specified.

You will acquaint the Memorialists that I am unable to accede to their request.

My Despatch of the 17th of November, 1847, will have informed you that Officers of the East India Company's Service are not entitled to participate in the advantages specified in the Regulations above adverted to, and I enclose for your information a copy of a Despatch which I have addressed to the Lieutenant Governor of Van Diemen's Land, explaining the grounds upon which I have felt it to be out of my power to restore the advantages in question to Officers of the Indian Army.

SIR,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 59, of the 3rd of April last, in which, for the reasons therein assigned, you suggest that the advantages held out to Officers of the Army and Navy settling in the Colonies, should be restored to Officers of the East India Company's Service proposing to settle in Van Diemen's Land, and I have to express my regret that I cannot accede to your suggestion.

Without for a moment questioning the merits of the Officers of the East India Company's Army, or the value of the services which they have rendered to their country, yet, as it does not fall within their duty to render any direct services to the Colonies, in like manner as the Officers of the Queen's Army or Navy, I have not considered that they could justly be allowed the same boon out of the public lands which constitute one of the resources of the several Colonies; and as the East India Company has declined to secure for them the advantages in question by indemnifying those Colonies which should grant them, I have been unavoidably compelled to withhold from them the facilities which you wish to extend to them, and which, if they were to be granted on the sole ground of the undoubted respectability of this class of settlers, could scarcely be denied, on the same ground to any Emigrants of good character and circumstances proceeding from this country.

SIR,

Much inconvenience has at times been experienced by Officers, who have come home from the different Colonies on leave of absence, from the want of a sufficient voucher, as to the period to which they may have received their salary in the Colony, and the precise amount of the allowance to which they may be entitled while absent.

2. The 4th chapter of the Printed Colonial Regulations, section 7, directs that the Governor should furnish every Officer proceeding on leave of absence, with a duplicate Despatch to the Secretary of State, showing, amongst other particulars, the amount of salary attached to the Office, and the date to which the Officer had received any payment on account of salary, and enclosing a Certificate to that effect from the Colonial Treasury.

3. It will not only be necessary that those directions should be regularly observed by you, but it is very desirable that you should make generally known to the Officers of your Government, the necessity of procuring such Certificates before quitting the Colony, on leave of absence, warning them at the same time, that if they neglect that precaution, they must be prepared to find that their absent allowance cannot be issued to them, for the period for which the required information is wanting.
