#### POSTAGE.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct, that in future all letters whatsoever, addressed to the Departments and Officers of Government on the Public Service, and forwarded by Post, shall be pre-paid, otherwise it will be necessary to refuse them with a view to their being returned to the writers, who, under the 22nd clause of the Act of the Governor and Council, 13 Victoria, No. 38, will be liable to pay the Postage thereon.

2. The only exception to this rule will be in the case of Clergymen or persons not in the Public Service, who may have occasion to send in Returns to any Department of Covernment of an entirely public nature; such for instance, as the Returns of Births, Marriages, and Burials; but the nature of the Return must, in all such cases, 3. To reduce the cost of Postage to individuals having occasion to make remittances to the Colonial Treasury or any other Public Department, all sums under one pound, should be remitted in Postage stamps of the equivalent value, for which credit will be given as cash.

FERRY ACROSS THE SNOWY RIVER,
AT JANMIMGEE.

THE Dues arising from the Ferry over the Snowy River, at Janningee, will be put up to auction, by the Clerk of Petty Sessions of Bombala, at the Police Office, Bombala, on Wednesday, the 23rd proximo, at 12 o'clock, for twelve months, commencing the 1st day of February, 1850.

### COMMONS.—RICHMOND HILL AND MULGRAVE PLACE.

THE descriptions of the undermentioned portions of land at Richmond Hill and Mulgrave Place, granted by His Excellency Governor King, in the year 1804, as Commons for the Districts of Richmond Hill and Nelson respectively, are published for general information.
