JETTY.—CORIO.

THE following additional Rules for the regulation of the Jetty at Corio, Geelong, Port Phillip, having been made by the Justices of the Peace, acting in and for Geelong, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, in terms of the Act of Council, 5th William IV., No. 13, are published for general information.

10.—No warps, chains, or ropes of or belonging to any vessel, shall be made fast to any of the piles of the Jetty, but shall be fastened to the ring bolts provided for that purpose.

- 11.—Vessels first coming at or near the wharf, to have precedence in coming alongside the Jetty or discharge or take in cargo, and vessels discharging cargo, to have the preference of the wharf.
- 12.—Timber or goods landed at the wooden part of the Jetty, to be removed within twelve hours from the time of landing, and are not to be placed upon any ring bolt, so as to obstruct the free use thereof.
- 13.—All vessels to slack down their chain cables, and other fastenings when required to do so, in order to allow other vessels to come alongside, or to leave the wharf.
- 14.—Tarpaulins properly stretched and spread, are to be used in shipping or discharging ballast, so as to prevent any part thereof from falling overboard.
- 15.—No ballast, rubbish, or filth, to be thrown from any vessel or boat, at or near the wharf.
- 16.—All vessels coming alongside the wharf, are to anchor and drop their anchor at least fifty fathoms from the Jetty.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee, according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice, who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's Rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.

TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE LAND AND IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

SEALD Tenders will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the twenty-fourth of June, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the Sum of Ten thousand pounds on the following security, and subject to the under-mentioned terms and conditions, viz. :—

(1.) Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must be endorsed "Tender for Debentures."

(2.) If the tender be accepted, Land and Immigration Debentures for £100 each, secured upon the Territorial Revenue of the Sydney or Middle District, will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of 3¼d. per diem, or £4 18s. 10½d. per £100 per annum, payable half-yearly, on the first of January, and first of July.

(3.) They will be receivable as cash at any time for the purchase of Crown Lands in the Sydney District, or for any other payment due on account of the Territorial Revenue within the same.

(4.) The principal will not otherwise be payable for a period of less than three years from the date of the Debenture, but it will be redeemable at par at any time thereafter at the option of the Government, but not of the holder, on three months' notice to that effect being given in the New South Wales or London *Gazette*, according as the same may be payable in the Colony or in England.

(5.) The principal will also be redeemable at par, at the option of the holder for the time being after the expiration of five years from the date of the Debenture, on his giving three months' notice to that effect to the Colonial Agent General, in London, or the Colonial Treasurer in Sydney, as the case may be.

(6.) At the expiration of the three months' notice given either by the Government or the holder, the interest on the Debenture to which such notice shall apply, will cease and determine.

(7.) The principal and interest of each Debenture will be payable at the option of the holder for the time being, either in Sydney or London; any change which it may be desired to make in this respect, being previously registered at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, and in the Office of the Colonial Agent General, in London, and endorsed upon the Debenture, which must be presented accordingly at both these Offices for that purpose.

(8.) Whenever a Debenture may be made payable in London, a Duplicate thereof will be transmitted by the Colonial Treasurer to the Colonial Agent General by such opportunity as the holder may desire, in order that the same may be available on proof of the loss of the original.

(9.) The Debentures will be transferable, if made out in blank, in the same manner as Exchequer Bills; but if made payable to any individual or firm, then by endorsement as in the case of Bills of Exchange.

(10.) Any number of Debentures will, for the convenience of the holders, be consolidated into one or more of the aggregate amount, on application at the Colonial Treasury, provided that such consolidate Debentures shall be issued for even sums of £500 or £1000 only.

From this comparative statement, the remarkable dryness of the year 1849, is manifest; the quantity of Rain fallen having amounted to barely one half as much as the *minimum* of previous years, and not to one third of the maximum of those years.

It also discovers that the greatest average fall has occurred in the months of January, February, April, and July; April being the wettest of these: And the least average quantity, in the months of September, October, and November, November appearing to be the driest.

It may however be here remarked that in the months of April, 1841, and October, 1844, there occurred most extraordinary falls of rain, (*viz.*, 20.12 inches on the 29th of April, and 20.41 inches on the 15th of October;) and which swell the averages of those months to perhaps an unfair standard; inasmuch as such unusual quantities might not occur again for years, if ever. In any calculations, I should therefore be disposed to reduce the *average* of each of those months by *one* inch. April would still maintain its superiority in the scale: But *October* would sink to a standard below November; and upon a comparison of the two months, through the 9 years *October* does (with the exception of 1844,) appear to be the driest.
