STOCKADE AND GAOL, MELBOURNE.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Gaol at Melbourne, and the Stockade in course of erection at the western end of that Gaol outside the enclosing walls of the airing and treadmill yards, have been appointed places at which male offenders under order or sentence of transportation, or any order or sentence passed in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled "*An Act to substitute other punishments for transportation beyond the Seas,*" shall be detained and be liable to be kept to hard labor.

2. His Excellency also directs it to be notified that, under the provisions of the said Act, any person found at, or near, or in any manner communicating with the said Stockade, without the permission of the Governor or other proper Officer, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, on conviction, be liable to a fine or penalty of £20, or to imprisonment for three months, or both;—of which all persons are hereby required to take notice.

**CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED  
DISTRICTS.**

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee, according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice, who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's Rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.

**TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE LAND AND  
IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.**
