GROSE FARM.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the following Paddocks at Grose Farm, will be put up separately to Auction, for Sale on Lease for one year, commencing 1st August next, at the Government Sale Room in the old Military Barracks, Sydney, at Eleven o'clock, on Thursday, the 18th day of July.

Lot 1.—Estimated to contain eighteen acres, and comprises two paddocks, fenced, with the old Stockade, and is situate on the north-western end of Grose Farm; but excludes the Police Station at the western extremity. Upset price £30.

Lot 2.—Estimated to contain twenty-two and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced, and is situated on the south-west corner of the farm. Upset price £15.

Lot 3.—Estimated to contain twenty-six and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced; it is bounded by a fence dividing it from lots 2, 4, and 5. Upset price £18.

Lot 4.—Estimated to contain seventeen and a-half acres, in one paddock fenced; it is bounded by the Parramatta Road, and divided by a fence from lots 3, 5, and 6, and the road along the creek, bounding lot 1; out of this lot will be reserved a road, extending from a slip panel on the Parramatta Road to the creek near the Stockade. TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the night of the 18th ultimo, a stack of wheat, containing about two hundred bushels, the property of Richard Hawke, of Native Dog Creek, in the District of Hartley, was maliciously set on fire; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty pounds, will be paid to any free person or persons, who may, within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the party or parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving such information, be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such prisoner of the Crown, of a Conditional Pardon.

TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE LAND AND IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

SEALD Tenders will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the twenty-second of July, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the Sum of Ten Thousand Pounds on the following security, and subject to the under-mentioned terms and conditions, viz. :—

(1.) Each tender must be for an even sum of hundreds of pounds, and must be endorsed "Tender for Debentures."

(2.) If the tender be accepted, Land and Immigration Debentures for £100 each, secured upon the Territorial Revenue of the Sydney or Middle District, will be issued for the sum advanced, and will bear interest at the rate of 3½d. per diem, or £4 18s. 10½d. per £100 per annum, payable half-yearly, on the first of January, and first of July.

(3.) They will be receivable as cash at any time for the purchase of Crown Lands in the Sydney District, or for any other payment due on account of the Territorial Revenue within the same.

(4.) The principal will not otherwise be payable for a period of less than three years from the date of the Debenture, but it will be redeemable at par at any time thereafter at the option of the Govern-

ment, but not of the holder, on three months' notice to that effect being given in the New South Wales or London *Gazette*, according as the same may be payable in the Colony or in England.

(5.) The principal will also be redeemable at par, at the option of the holder for the time being after the expiration of five years from the date of the Debenture, on his giving three months' notice to that effect to the Colonial Agent General, in London, or the Colonial Treasurer, in Sydney, as the case may be.

(6.) At the expiration of the three months notice given either by the Government or the holder, the interest on the Debenture to which such notice shall apply, will cease and determine.

(7.) The principal and interest of each Debenture will be payable at the option of the holder for the time being, either in Sydney or London; any change which it may be desired to make in this respect, being previously registered at the Colonial Treasury, in Sydney, and in the office of the Colonial Agent General, in London, and endorsed upon the Debenture, which must be presented accordingly at both these Offices for that purpose.

(8.) Whenever a Debenture may be made payable in London, a Duplicate thereof will be transmitted by the Colonial Treasurer to the Colonial Agent General by such opportunity as the holder may desire, in order that the same may be available on proof of the loss of the original.

(9.) The Debentures will be transferable, if made out in blank, in the same manner as Exchequer Bills; but if made payable to any individual or firm, then by endorsement as in the case of Bills of Exchange.

(10.) Any number of Debentures will, for the convenience of the holders, be consolidated into one or more of the aggregate amount, on application at the Colonial Treasury, provided that such consolidate Debentures shall be issued for even sums of £500 or £1000 only.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND SETTLED DIS-
TRICTS.

PURCHASE OF PORTIONS OF LICENSED RUNS.

WITH a view to carry into effect the intention of the sixth section of Chapter II, of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847, which confers on Lessees of Crown Lands beyond the Settled Districts, the right of purchasing, during the continuance of the Lease, portions of their Runs without competition; and in order to obviate the inconvenience which would be experienced if those who are entitled to exercise that right were compelled to await the issue of Leases, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to notify, that all Licensed occupants of Crown Lands in the intermediate and unsettled Districts, who may desire to purchase portions of their Runs, with a view to obtain at once the right of raising produce for sale, or for any other purpose, are now at liberty to forward their applications so to purchase, in conformity with the Rules laid down in the above Order in Council, as hereunder enumerated: Provided that their claims to lease the particular lands which they desire to buy, be not the subject of any unsettled dispute before the Boundary Commissioners; and that they be, in all other respects, unquestioned.

2. The conditions specified in Her Majesty's Order in Council are as follows:—

- (1.) The extent of Land so to be purchased, must in no case be less than 160 acres.
- (2.) If the lot sold to the Licensee be less than 320 acres, the expense of measuring it must be borne by the purchaser.
- (3.) The price to be paid for any such Lot cannot be less than the general minimum price of one pound per acre; but if there be reason to suppose that any Lands so applied for, possess peculiar advantages, whether of water frontage or otherwise, which would render it fit that a higher price should be paid for such Lands, the Governor may require the land to be assessed by valuers, appointed in the manner directed in the third section of chapter II, of the said Order in Council.

(4.) Each lot must be rectangular, unless the features of the country, or the course of any river or stream, render a deviation from the rectangular form necessary; and in every case, two sides at least, of the lot must be directed to the cardinal points of the compass.

(5.) The two opposite sides of any stream or watercourse which, according to the practice of the department of the Surveyor General, ought to form a Boundary between different sections or lots, shall in no case be included in the same lot.

(6.) No single lot shall have more than 440 yards of water frontage, for 160 acres, or more than a like proportion of water frontage for any quantity greater than 160 acres, but the water frontage shall be reckoned according to the distance from one extreme point thereof to the other in a right line, and not according to the bendings of the watercourse or river: And the Governor, or other Officer duly authorised in that behalf, shall have the right of refusing to sell any Lot or Lots, in every case where it may appear to him that the sale of such Lot or Lots respectively, might give an undue command over water required for the beneficial occupation and cultivation of the Lands adjoining either side of any stream or watercourse.

3. It is of course to be distinctly understood that the Government is not pledged to comply with any such application to purchase, even though the right of the Applicant to the Lease be unquestioned. The Government will still exercise the right conferred by the eighth section of chapter II, of the Order in Council, to except from any such sale all such lands as it may appear expedient to reserve for any of the purposes therein referred to.

4. Persons desirous of availing themselves of this Regulation, should address their applications to the Chief Commissioner of Crown Lands, in Sydney, or to His Honor the Superintendent of Port Phillip, if their Runs be situated in that District. These applications should show the Commissioner's District, the name of the Licensee, the name of the Run, and should set forth, as accurately as possible, a description of the Land applied for.

5. As this privilege of purchasing will remove all excuse for the sale or barter of produce raised upon Lands held from the Crown for pastoral purposes only, His Excellency desires it to be notified, that such sale or barter will be strictly prohibited in future.
