STREETS.—SYDNEY.

WITH reference to the Government Notice, dated 14th February last, relative to the opening and making of certain Streets or continuations of Streets, to be called *Cleveland and Abercrombie Streets*, in the southern parts of the City of Sydney; notice is hereby given, in conformity with the Act of Council 4th Wm. IV., No. 11, intituled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof*," that, after due consideration of all objections to the proposed lines of Streets or continuations of Streets as above notified, which have been transmitted in pursuance of the said notice, and in conformity with the said Act; His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the said lines, *with the exception of that portion of Cleveland-street which lies between Abercrombie Place and the Cook's River Road*: And it is therefore hereby declared expedient to open and make the Streets or continuations of Streets therein referred to, excepting as aforesaid, according to the map or plan thereof, to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General; and all persons intending to claim compensation in respect of the said lines, are hereby reminded that notice must be

served upon the Colonial Secretary, *within forty days* from the date hereof, in such manner and terms as are prescribed by the second and thirty-second sections of the Act above referred to, or they will for ever be foreclosed from such claim.

**CROWN LANDS WITHIN THE SETTLED
DISTRICTS.**

(LEASES BY AUCTION.)

Under the Regulations of 29th March, 1848.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, for the information of all persons concerned, that Leases of the hereunder described portions of land which have been forfeited for non-payment of the rent, or for non-renewal, will be put up to auction at 11 o'clock of Wednesday, the seventh day of August next, at the places respectively mentioned, and upon the conditions set forth in the Regulations in question.

**TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A

**TRANSFERABLE AND REMITTABLE LAND AND
IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.**

SEALD Tenders will be received at this Office, until noon of Monday, the twenty-second of July, from persons desirous of advancing the whole or any portion of the Sum of Ten Thousand Pounds on the following security, and subject to the under-mentioned terms and conditions, viz. :—

(2.)
