· GRANT OF LAND.

THE description of the following portion of Land is published for general information, in order that the party concerned, may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of one month from this date, if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of the same will be executed accordingly, viz.:—

42. Mrs. Elizabeth Finley, 100, One bundred acres, parish unnamed, near Diamond Creek; commencing at a point south 27 degrees and 40 minutes, west 9 chains and 10 links from the intersection of Diamond Creek with the creek bounding J. T. Hughes' 1000 acres on the west, and bounded on the north by a line bearing east 21 chains and 74 links; on the south by a line bearing south 46 chains; on the south by a line bearing west 21 chains and 74 links; and on the west by a line bearing north 46 chains to the commencing corner.
