TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the morning of Saturday, the 13th instant, a man named John Dwyer, was murdered within one and a half miles of the Township of Carcoar; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty-five pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may, within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the parties guilty of the above murder; and if the person giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to such Prisoner of the Crown of a Conditional Pardon.

CROWN LANDS—COMMONAGE RIGHTS.

IN order to prevent misapprehension on the part of purchasers or intended purchasers of Town and Suburban allotments, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, with reference to the 2nd Clause of the Regulations of 29th March,

1848, that the possession of Town, Village, or Suburban allotments, whether situated in the Settled, Intermediate, or Unsettled class of Lands, does not carry with it any right of commonage over adjacent Crown Lands, unless in those cases in which land reserved for the extension of a Town may have been given up as a pasture to be used by the inhabitants under established regulations as long as it may remain unalienated.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the state of the survey not yet admitting of the issue of Leases for Runs beyond the Settled Districts, all existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as Licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the License fee, according to the quantity of Stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such Run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Governor shall be in a position to grant Leases of Runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any Licensee under this Notice, who may obtain a Lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's Rent, for so much of the amount paid for his License, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the License was granted.
