OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DIS- TRICTS.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, to all occupants of Crown Land for Pastoral Purposes, beyond the Settled Districts of Port Phillip, that the renewal of license for such occupation pending the issue of Leases, which, in pursuance with the arrangement hitherto

made, would take place from the 1st of July next, and embrace the twelve months, ending 30th June, 1851, will only be effected for the six months, ending 31st December, 1850, when, if requisite, further renewal for the entire year, commencing 1st January, and ending 31st December, 1851, will be sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor.

ROADS.

WITH reference to the Government notice dated 10th May last, relative to the opening and making a certain parish road from the Town of Geelong, in the County of Grant, through the County of Grenville, to the Township of Colac, in the County of Polworth, in the District of Port Phillip, notice is hereby given, in conformity with the Act of Council 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof," that as no objections have been made, within the period allowed by law, to the line in question, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the said road, as already notified; and it is hereby declared expedient to open and make the said road according to the map or plan to be seen at the Office of the Surveyor General, in Sydney, and in that of the Surveyor in charge, at Melbourne; and all persons intending to claim compensation in respect of the said line, are hereby reminded, that notice must be served upon the Colonial Secretary, within forty days of the date hereof, in such manner and forms as are provided by the sixth and thirty-second sections of the Act above referred to, or they will be for ever foreclosed from such claim.

PUBLIC NOTICE.

IN consequence of the frequent unlawful removal of wood from the Crown Lands around Melbourne by woodcutters and others, it is considered desirable that public attention should be called to the fact that, by His Excellency's proclamation of the 5th July, 1849, all timber, either growing or dead, on the Crown Lands within the five mile boundary or limits hereunder defined, is strictly prohibited from being removed.

Parties offending are subject to penalties under 7th and 8th Geo. 4th cap. 30 and 9th Vict. No. 14.

Five mile boundary around the City of Melbourne.

A line drawn from a point on the shores of Port Phillip Bay, in the parish of Truganini, distant five miles from the south-west corner of the corporate limits of the City of Melbourne; running northwards until it meets the western boundary line of section No. 5, in the parish of Cut Paw Paw; thence northward, along the section line, to the north-east corner

of section 19, in the same parish; thence by a line drawn at a distance of five miles from the north-west corner of the corporate limits of the said city, until it meets the north-west corner of Thomas Walker's 930 acres, in the parish of Will Will Rook, continuing thence eastward, along the section lines which form the northern boundary of Thomas Walker's 930 acres, in the said parish, and Sylvester John Brown's 990 acres, in the parish of Keelbundora, and parallel with the northern limits of the said city; thence by a line in the south-east direction, at a distance of five miles from a point in the corporate limits of the City of Melbourne, being the south-east corner of Henry Ward Mason's 132 acres in the parish of Jika Jika, until it meets the prolongation southwards of the section line forming the eastern boundary of portion No. 1, in the parish of Bulleen (being part of Unwin's special survey) thence running south along that section line, and distant five miles from the eastern boundary of the said City of Melbourne, crossing the Koorong Koot Creek to the first section line north of Dendy's special survey; thence by a line in a south-west direction to the shores of Port Phillip Bay, at a distance of five miles from the south-east corner of the corporate limits of the said city; thence by the shore of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.
