CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

MEASUREMENT OF THE BOUNDARIES OF
RUNS.

WITH reference to the Notice issued on the 28th July, 1849, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct the issue of the following further notice respecting the Surveys of the Boundaries of Runs, for the purposes of the Leases claimed under her Majesty's Order in Council of the 9th March, 1847.

1. The Surveyor General having reported, the price of £2 per linear mile, is now found to be much higher than is required to cover the expense of the measurement of the Boundaries of Runs, the price is hereby reduced to Ten Shillings per linear mile, which will be charged in all cases in which it may be necessary to have recourse to measurement, in order to render the descriptions of the boundaries sufficiently complete, to satisfy the rule of law, which holds any grant or other conveyance from the Crown to be absolutely null and void, if the property intended to be conveyed be not described with certainty.

2. A formal survey will not be required by the Government, in any case in which the claimant of a Lease shall have furnished, under the Notice

of the 7th October, 1847, such a description of the boundaries of his run as will satisfy the requirements of the law above referred to, or will admit of being rendered sufficiently perfect for that purpose, by explanation afforded on the spot to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, or other person employed by him to estimate the extent and grazing capabilities of the run.

3. Where no survey is made, there will, of course, be no charge, but any person who may have furnished a description sufficiently perfect to enable the Government to dispense with a survey, but who may, nevertheless, be desirous, for the sake of his own greater security, to obtain a technical description of his Lease, can have the boundaries of his run measured at the above stated rate, of Ten Shillings per linear mile.

4. The charge for measurements performed by the Surveyors employed under the direction of the Commissioners for the settlement of disputed boundaries, will be the same as that fixed by this notice for other measurements, viz:—Ten shillings per linear mile; but where the descriptions furnished by the applicants are deemed sufficient for the Lease, it will not be necessary that a measured survey should be made of any portion of the boundary excepting that which is immediately the subject of dispute.

5. Wherever the boundaries of a run are coincident with those of a reserve,

or with any lines which have been surveyed by the Government for a public purpose, no charge, on account of their measurement will be made to the Lessee.

6. In reference to a misapprehension which appears to have been entertained, respecting the meaning of the Notice of the 28th July, 1849, in this particular, it is hereby explained that the Government does not intend to take a double payment for the same survey, and that, therefore, where the boundaries of two runs, requiring measurement, are coincident, the expense of the measurement will be divided equally, between the two parties, each being charged one-half of the fixed rate of Ten Shillings per mile.

POLICE DISTRICTS.

SEVERAL New Police Districts having recently been established, and certain modifications having become necessary in the boundaries of some of those previously existing; His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct the publication of the following Boundaries of the Police Districts of the colony (including the District of Port Phillip,) and to cancel all former notices of the same character.

2. His Excellency deems it proper to repeat the intimation made on previous occasions of this kind to the effect that, the establishment of "Police Districts" is intended to facilitate the Police operations of the Colony, and not to supersede or in any way interfere with the boundaries of Counties already proclaimed, or which may hereafter be proclaimed.

PORT PHILLIP DISTRICT.

1. BOURKE.

To comprise the County of Bourke (without the Corporate limits of the City

of Melbourne); also the Counties of Mornington and Evelyn, viz: the Werribee River to its source in the great dividing range, by that range easterly to the head of the Plenty River; thence continuing round the heads of the Yarra Yarra river to the source of the Buneep Buneep River by that river to its mouth; by the Warrangine Range in a southerly direction and a line bearing south to Cape Paterson; by the sea coast to Point Nepean; by the shores of Port Phillip Bay, to the south-east corner of the parish of south Melbourne, following the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of the Corporate limits of the City of Melbourne; and again by the shores of Port Phillip Bay to the mouth of the Werribee River, including French and Phillip Island and the small Islands in Western Port Bay.

2. GRANT.

The bounds of the County of Grant, viz:—The Werribee River from its mouth to its source; thence by the dividing range to the source of the Yarrowee (or Leigh) River; by the Yarrowee to its confluence with the Barwon; by the Barwon upwards to a creek in H. Hopkin's purchased land; by this creek upwards and a line south-east across the range to the Salt Creek, the Salt Creek to the sea coast; and by the sea coast and the waters of Port Phillip to the mouth of the Werribee River.

3. PORTLAND.

The South Australian boundary line from Munroe's Inn south to the sea coast; thence along the coast to the mouth of the Eumeralla or Shaw River, following that river up to one of its sources at Mount Napier; thence by a line westerly to Munroe's station on the Crawford River; by that river to its junction with the Glenelg, following the Glenelg River up to the crossing of the Adelaide Road; and along that road to the South Australian boundary line at Munroe's Inn.

4. BELFAST.

Including Warrambool, commencing at the mouth of the Eumeralla or Shaw River, and following the coast line eastward to Cudjee Cudjee Creek; thence by that creek upwards to Lake Proömbeet, by the western margin of that lake to the Port Fairy Road, by the Port Fairy Road to the Hopkin's River; thence by a road to Mount Rouse and a line to Mount Napier, and by a branch of the Eumeralla or Shaw River to the sea coast.

5. ALBERTON.

On the west by the Counties of Mornington and Evelyn; on the north by the Australian Alps; on the east and south by the La Trobe River from its source to Lake Wellington; thence by a line south to the sea coast; and by the sea coast to Cape Patterson.

6. GRANGE BURN.

Commencing at the junction of the Crawford River with the Glenelg, and following up the latter river to the junction of the Wando; thence by the Wando River to its source, a line to the crossing place on the Glenelg River, near Armytage's station, following the Glenelg River to its source; thence by the dividing range to Mount Cole, by the course of the Hopkins River, to the crossing of the Portland Road, near Captain Adams' station, by the Portland Road to Mount Rouse; thence to Mount Napier, by a line westerly, to Munroe's station on the Crawford River, and by that river to its junction with the Glenelg.

7. CHEPSTOWE.

The Portland Bay Road from the Yarrowee or Leigh River (at Ormond's Inn), by Mount Elephant, to the Emu Creek; by the Emu Creek down to the crossing of the Port Fairy Road, near Neil Black's; thence by the Port Fairy Road to the Hopkins River, following the Hopkins River up to its source, at Mount Cole; thence by the Yarrowee (or Leigh) River; and by this river to the commencing point at Ormond's Inn.

8. BROKEN RIVER.

To comprise the Murray District, (with the exception of that portion south of the Howqua River,) viz. the Goulburn River, upwards, from its confluence with the Murray to the confluence of the Howqua River, by the Howqua River to its source at Mount Buller; thence by the Australian Alps to the head of the Murray River; and by that river to the confluence of the Goulburn.

9. COLAC.

Commencing at the south of the Cudjee Cudjee Creek and following the coast eastward to the mouth of the Salt Creek near Point Road Knight; thence along the eastern boundary of Polworth and part of Grenville to the crossing place of the Portland Bay Road, over the Yarrowee or Leigh River near Ormond's Inn; thence along this road to the Emu Creek past Mount Elephant; thence by the Emu Creek down to the crossing of the Port Fairy Road near Neil Black's station; thence by the

Port Fairy Road to Lake Proombeet; by the western margin of that lake to the Cudjee Cudjee Creek; and following that creek down to the sea coast.

10. MOUNT MACEDON.

By the dividing range from Mount Cole to the head of Mollison's Creek; thence by a line northerly to the head of Mount Ida Creek; by this creek and the Campaspie River to the confluence of the latter with the Murray; by the Murray down to a point due north from Lake Beal Beal; thence by this line to Lake Beal Beal; and by the Avoca River up to its source at Mount Cole.

11. HORSHAM.

Commencing at the crossing of the Adelaide Road over the Glenelg near Armytage's station, and following the Glenelg up to its source near Mount William; thence by the dividing range to Mount Cole; by the Avoca River to Lake Beal Beal, and a line bearing north to the Murray River; by the Murray River to the South Australian boundary; by the South Australian boundary line, south, to the mallee scrub and a line south-easterly to the crossing of the Adelaide Road on the Glenelg River.

12. FLOODING CREEK.

Bounded on the west and south by the La Trobe River, from its source to Lake Wellington; thence, by a line south, to the sea coast; by the sea to Cape Howe; thence between the middle and Port Phillip Districts, to the nearest source of the Murray River in the Australian Alps; and by the Australian Alps to the source of the La Trobe River.

13. KILMORE.

From the head of Mollison's Creek, along the great dividing range, to Mount Bulla, by the Howqua River, to the Goulburn; thence, by the Goulburn and part of the Murray River, to the junction of the Campaspie; thence by the Campaspie, to Mount Ida Creek; by this creek to its source, and a line southerly to the head of Mollison's Creek.

14. MOSQUITO CREEK.

Commencing at Munroe's Inn, on the South Australian boundary line, and following that line northward, to the mallee scrub; thence, south-easterly, to the crossing place on the Glenelg River, near Armytage's station, by a line, to the head of the Wando River, following that river, down to its junction with the Glenelg; by the Glenelg, to the crossing place at M'Kinlay's Inn; and by the Adelaide Road, to the South Australian boundary, at Munroe's Inn.

CUSTOM-HOUSE, MELBOURNE.
TENDERS will be received until noon of Saturday, the 9th day of February next, from parties willing to contract for the continuation of the Dwarf enclosing wall to the Custom House, at Melbourne.

At the foot of every Tender there must be a memorandum, signed by two parties, stating that they are willing to enter into a bond for the due performance of the contract, and undertaking, should the Tender be accepted, severally to execute and deliver at the Office of the Crown Solicitor, in Melbourne within six days of the usual notification of acceptance, a bond to Her Majesty in the sum of £100, for securing the due fulfilment of such contract; otherwise such Tender will not be taken into consideration. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest tender.

CIRCUIT COURTS.

REGULÆ GENERALES.

- No. 81. **Certain causes may be ordered to be tried at Circuit Town.** It is ordered that the following General Rules do take effect and be in force from and after the Fourteenth day of January, 1850:
That where it shall be made to appear in application to the Judge that any cause being ready for trial, may (having reference to the nature of the question, or the residence of the witnesses or other circumstances), be more advantageously tried on Circuit, an order may be made after notice to the adverse party, for the trial to take place at such Circuit Town as the Judge shall for that purpose appoint.
- No. 82. **As to futuro Cases.** That the like order may be made in any other cause hereafter when the same shall be set down for trial at Melbourne, or the venue shall be there laid if the Judge shall think it more fitting that the same should be tried at a Circuit Town.
- No. 83. **Venue to be laid in Declaration.** That every declaration hereafter filed shall be marked in the margin with the name of the town wherein it is intended that the cause shall be tried (i.e.) Melbourne or Geelong.
- No. 84. **Order of Business in Circuit.** That the delivery of the Gaol in Circuit Towns shall take precedence of the Civil Business, and that no cause be entered for any day of the sittings earlier than the third day.
- No. 85. **Causes for Assessment.** That all causes for assessment of damages on Circuit shall be set down in Melbourne four (4) clear days before the first day of the sittings, and come on for trial before defended causes.
- No. 86. **Entering Causes for Trial.** That all causes for trial on Circuit shall be set down in Melbourne eight (8) clear days at the least before the first day of the sittings, and shall be set down for the third day of the sittings. Provided that issues to be tried by a special jury of four shall always have precedence of such as are for trial by a common jury of twelve; and those for trial by such common jury precedence of such as are for trial by a special jury of twelve.
- No. 87. **Notice of Trial.** That in every cause for trial in Circuit, the plaintiff shall give at the least ten (10) clear days' notice of trial.
- No. 88. **Nisi Prius Record.** That at a convenient time previous to the holding of any Circuit Court, the Deputy Registrar shall deliver the Nisi Prius record in all cases for trial in Circuit to the Clerk of Assize and Nisi Prius for such Court, who shall vered to Clerk bring the same into Court on the day of trial, and afterwards return the of Assize and same into the hands of the said Deputy Registrar, together with a minute Nisi Prius. of the proceedings at such trial.
- No. 89. **"Fees."** That the same fees shall be demanded and taken for all business transacted at any Circuit Court as are demandable for the like business transacted in the Supreme Court, at Melbourne.
