By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, dated the 5th day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty, Port Melbourne, in the District of Port Phillip, was, from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, declared to be a Free Warehousing Port; and whereas it is expedient to appoint Geelong, in the District of Port Phillip, to be a Free Warehousing Port, within the limits of the Port of Melbourne, as defined by the 55th Section of the Act of Council, 9th Victoria, No. 15: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, in virtue of the authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby order and direct that Geelong, in the said District of Port Phillip, shall be, and the same is hereby declared and established as a Free Warehousing Port within the limits of the said Port of Melbourne.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, dated the fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty, Port Melbourne, in the District of Port Phillip, was, from and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty, declared to be a free Warehousing Port: And whereas it is expedient to establish a Port of Entry and Clearance at Port Albert, within the limits of the Port of Melbourne, as defined by the 56th section of the Act of Council, 9th Victoria, No. 15: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, in virtue of the authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby order and direct that Port Albert, in the said District of Port Phillip, shall be, and the same is hereby declared and established as a Port of Entry and Clearance, within the limits of the said Port of Melbourne.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such Courts, in the County of Cumberland," it was amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint: And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "An Act to amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests in the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne, and County of Bourke respectively," it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established, or to be established within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town (now City) of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatsoever, for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds: Now, I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests, in and for the City of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall be holden, during the year 1851, at the City of Melbourne, at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court of Requests, for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds, for the City of Melbourne, and County of Bourke, shall be holden at the Court House, Melbourne on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, namely:—Monday, 3rd February; Thursday, 20th March; Monday, 21st April; Monday, 19th May; Thursday, 12th June; Monday, 21st July; Monday, 18th August; Monday, 22nd September; Monday, 13th October; Thursday, 20th November, Monday, 15th December.

The "New Sittings" of the Court of Requests for the City of Melbourne and County of Bourke, for the trial of all cases from ten to thirty pounds, shall commence and be holden at the Court

House, Melbourne, on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day, as may be found necessary viz:—Thursday, 6th February; Thursday, 24th April; Monday, 16th June; Thursday, 21st August; Thursday, 16th October; Thursday, 18th December.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS IN 1851.

**WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE
RATES AT THE QUEEN'S
WHARF.**

AT TWELVE o'clock, on Friday, 29th November next, the Sub-Treasurer will put up to auction, at the Sub-Treasury, Melbourne, the Lease for one year, commencing the 1st January, 1851, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates, payable at the Queen's Wharf, Melbourne, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 10th Victoria, No. 11.

The Lessee will be entitled to the free use of the Wharf, to collect dues, for depositing goods thereon, either for shipment or discharge, as well as for all other purposes appertaining to a Wharf.

The use of the Customs shed near the Wharf will be allowed to the lessee of the Rates when not fully occupied by the Customs Department.

The use of the Wharf will be reserved as a public thoroughfare, or of the landing or embarking passengers and other person at the same, free of any charge whatsoever; and the steps will have to be kept free from all goods or other obstructions.

The persons who shall be declared to be the highest bidder, if the bidding be accepted, must immediately enter into a Bond with two sufficient sureties, each of whom is to be present at the knocking down of the rates, and Warrant of Attorney, securing regular payment of the rent by equal monthly instalments before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, containing an engagement binding them to a due observance of the conditions.

It is to be understood that this notice does not include the Wharfage and Tonnage rates at Geelong, but has reference to the Queen's Wharf at Melbourne solely.

**PENTRIDGE STOCKADE.—PORT
PHILLIP.**

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that the Stockade erected at the Village of Pentridge, near Melbourne, including the whole of the Government Reserve of forty-three acres three roods and nineteen perches, on which the Stockade is situated, has been appointed a place at which male offenders under order or sentence of transportation, or any order or sentence passed in pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intitled, "An Act to substitute other punishments for transportation beyond the seas,"

shall be detained and be liable to be kept to hard labor.

2. His Excellency also directs it to be notified, that under the provisions of the said Act, any person found at or near or in any manner communicating with the said Stockade, or on the said Reserve, without the permission of the Governor or other proper officer, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction, be liable to a fine or penalty of Twenty Pounds, or to imprisonment for three months, or both;—of which all persons are hereby required to take notice.
