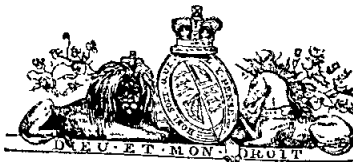

CROWN LANDS BROUGHT WITHIN THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(REQUIRING PAYMENT OF RENT FOR APPROVED SELECTIONS UNDER PRE-EMPTION.)

HIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for the information of all persons concerned, that, in pursuance of the 22nd clause of the Regulations of the 29th March, 1848, His Excellency has been pleased to approve of the claims which have been made by the parties enumerated in the annexed list to the Pre-emptive right to Leases of the several portions of Land referred to.

2. It is necessary that the Rent, viz.: Twenty shillings per Section of 640 acres for the present year, for the lands in question, be paid into the Sub-Treasury, at Melbourne, within one month from the present date; in default of which the Leases of the Lands will, in accordance with the 26th clause of the Regulations, be put up to sale by auction.
