PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the powers in me vested, by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to provide for the more effectual administration of Justice in New South Wales and its Dependencies," I did by my Proclamation bearing date the sixth day of December last, issued by and with the advice of the Executive Council, direct and appoint that a Circuit Court, for the trial of Criminal as well as Civil issues, should be holden at the Town of Geelong, in the District of Port Phillip, at the several times therein mentioned; and whereas it is expedient to fix the boundaries and limits of the Circuit District thereby established: now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the powers in me vested by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to make further provision for the trial of cases in the Circuit Courts of New South Wales, and to amend in certain respects the Act providing for the trial by Jury in such Courts," do by this my Proclamation for that purpose issued, proclaim and appoint, that the aforesaid Geelong Circuit District, shall consist of all parts of the said District of Port Phillip within the said Colony, comprehended within the Counties of Follet, Dundas, Villiers, Ripon, Hampden, Heytesbury, Polworth, and Grenville, according to the boundaries thereof, respectively set forth in my Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, and published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, of the thirtieth December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight; and also within the Counties or reputed Counties of Grant and Normanby; and also all parts of the said District comprehended within the following boundary lines, that is to say, commencing at the source of the Avoca, near Mount Cole, to Lake Beal Beal; and thence in a line north to the

Murray River; thence by the Murray River to the South Australian boundary line; thence by the South Australian boundary line to the Musquito Creek; thence by the northern boundary of the Counties Follet, Dundas, Villiers, and Ripon, to the source of the Avoca aforesaid.
