VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council.

An Act to prevent Cattle being driven through the Towns of East and West Maitland, except at certain hours. [Assented to, 10th December, 1851.]

THEREAS it is necessary for the safety of the public to prevent the driving of cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, into or through the Towns of East and West Maitland, except at certain Preamble. hours: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, That from and after the passing of this Act no cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, shall be driven into or through any part of the said Towns of East and West Maitland, except between the hours of six No cattle to be driven of the clock in the afternoon and eight of the clock in the morning; and through East or West every person who shall drive or cause to be driven any such cattle as certain hours, under aforesaid, into or through any part of the said Towns at any other hour a penalty. shall, on conviction in a summary way before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding twenty shillings for each and every head of cattle so driven.

II. And be it enacted, That all penalties, fines, and forfeitures imposed by this Act shall be paid one moiety to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, for the public uses of the said Colony and in support of Appropriation of the Government thereof, and shall be applied in such manner as may penalties, &c. from time to time be directed by any Acts of the said Governor and Legislative Council; and the other moiety to the use of the informer or party prosecuting, who shall in all cases under this Act be deemed and taken to be a competent witness.

III. And be it enacted, That in the construction of this Act the word "cattle" shall extend to and include bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, and steers: Provided that nothing in this Act shall be held to apply to milch cows, or cattle in teams, or to working cattle.
