FIFTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that, on the morning of the 7th instant, Patrick M'Namara, a prisoner under committal for trial for murder, effected his escape from Maitland Gaol, His Excellency the Governor-General directs it to be notified, that a reward of Fifty pounds will be paid to any person who may, within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and lodging in safe custody of the above individual; or if the person giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon.

Description of the abovenamed Prisoner:

Name, Patrick M'Namara; ship, Woodbridge; arrival, 1841; condition, free; height, six feet; complexion, florid; hair, black; eyes, hazel; age, twenty-seven years; native place, Limerick. Remarks—PM on right fore arm, strong made man, had on a white Guernsey frock with dark spots on it, light fustian trowsers, cabbagetree hat and brown scarf, dark waistcoat with metal buttons.

Remarks—Had on at the time of his escape, a long brown over coat, tweed vest, and drab cloth trowsers; he was formerly attached to one of Sir Thomas Mitchell's Exploring Parties, and latterly practised as a Surgeon at Swan Hill, on the Edward River.

Robert Fraser alias Mackintosh; age, about 33 years; height, 5 feet 7 inches; dark eyes; brown hair.

Remarks—Nose injured by disease or accident; had on when he escaped, a brown velvet shooting jacket, tweed vest, and moleskin trowsers.

These prisoners are supposed to have proceeded in the direction of Victoria.

CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

DISPUTES RESPECTING BOUNDARIES OF RUNS.

WITH reference to the Notice from this Office, dated 4th April, 1851, it is hereby notified, for the information of all parties interested, that Mr. J. C. C. Boyd having resigned the cases therein committed to him for investigation under the Act of Council 11 Victoria, No. 61, these disputes have now been referred, by direction of His Excellency the Governor-General, to Mr. James R. Dalyell.

- 2. Within sixty days from the present date, it will be incumbent on the Claimant and opposing Claimant in each case, to lodge with the Commissioner to whom their claims have now been referred, a Memorial setting forth a true description of the party claiming, and of his usual residence, and of the land in respect of which a lease is claimed, and a true statement of the circumstances under which such claim is made.
- 3. The time and place of hearing each case will then be fixed by the Commissioner, who will notify the same to the respective Claimants, at least, one calendar month previous to the day so fixed.
- 4 Each Claimant and opposing Claimant will be required to pay into the hands of the Commissioner before the case is heard, the fees regulated by the 10th section of the Act, in default of which the lease of the party failing to make payment will be withheld.
- 5. Should one disputant only in any case appear to support his claim as set forth in his Memorial, the Commissioner is authorised to take evidence and report in his favor, by default; but in the event of both parties making default, no lease for either run can be prepared until a dividing line shall have been agreed upon, and the fees rightfully due under the Act lodged in the Colonial Treasury.
- 6. Forms of Memorial may be obtained from the Commissioners and at this Office.
