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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland passed in the twelfth and thirteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the carriage of Passengers in Merchant Vessels,*" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of any of Her Majesty's Possessions abroad, by any Proclamation to be by him, from time to time, issued for that purpose, (which shall take effect from the issuing thereof,) to declare the rule of computation by which the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from such Possession to any other place whatsoever, shall be computed for the purposes of the said Act, and to substitute for the articles of food and provisions specified in the said Act, such other articles of food and provisions as shall be a full equivalent for the same; Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, the Governor-General aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, issued for that purpose, do declare that the following shall be the rule of computation by which the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from New South Wales to the several places hereinafter enumerated, shall be computed, for the purposes of the said recited Act, that is to say:—

To Port Albert, Geelong, or Melbourne .....	14 days
Port Fairy or Portland .....	21 "
Hobart Town, Launceston, or Circular Head .....	16 "

And I do hereby further declare, that in addition to and irrespective of any provisions of their own, which any Passengers may have on board, the Master of every such ship shall make to each Passenger during the voyage, including the time of detention, if any, at any port or place before the termination of such voyage, the following issues of pure water, and sweet and wholesome provisions, being in accordance with the dietary scale fixed in the said recited Act, (that is to say,) of water at least three quarts daily, and of provisions after the rate per

week of two and a half pounds of bread or biscuit, not inferior in quality to what is usually called Navy biscuit, one pound of wheaten flour, five pounds of oatmeal, two pounds of rice, two ounces of tea, half a pound of sugar, and half a pound of molasses: Provided always, that such issues of provisions shall be made in advance, and not less often than twice a week, the first of such issues to be made on the day of embarkation: Provided also, that potatoes, when good and sound, may be substituted for either the oatmeal or rice, in the proportion of five pounds of potatoes to one pound of oatmeal or rice.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land,*" it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of New South Wales for the time being to fix such place or places within any part of the said Colony, and such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council constituted under the said recited Act, as he may think fit: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority so in me vested, announce and proclaim that the first Session of the present Legislative Council, for the despatch of business, shall commence and be holden on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of October now next ensuing, at Twelve o'clock at noon, in the building known as the Council Chambers, situated in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-sixth day of September, in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests and to extend the jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland,*" it was amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts or other portions of this Colony and its dependencies, and at such places respectively as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint: And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the Reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests in the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke respectively,*" it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established or to be established within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine in a summary way all actions whatsoever for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds: And whereas on the fifth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, His Excellency the Governor did, in pursuance of such

authority, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, appoint Courts of Requests to be holden at such places and at such times as therein mentioned; and whereas it is expedient that the said Courts should, during the months of October, November, and December, in this present year, be held on the days hereinafter mentioned, in lieu of the days in the said Proclamation appointed for the said months respectively: Now, I, the said Governor-General, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests in and for the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, shall be holden during the remainder of the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, at the times and places, and for the districts, hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—the Ordinary Sittings of the Court of Requests, for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds, for the City of Sydney and for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain Notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the seventeenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and fifty, and published in the *New South Wales Government Gazette*, shall commence and be holden on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, viz.:—Wednesday, 15th October: Monday, 3rd November: and Monday 1st December respectively.

The New Sittings of the said Court for the trial of all cases from ten to thirty pounds for the said City and Police District thereof, as aforesaid, shall commence and be holden on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary viz.:—Monday, 13th October, Monday, 17th November, and Friday, 5th December, respectively.

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the said Courts for the other Districts in the County of Cumberland, will commence on the undermentioned dates; and the "New Sittings" of the Courts for these Districts respectively, shall commence after the termination of the "Ordinary Sittings," and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, that is to say:—

At the Town of Campbell Town and for such portions of the Police District thereof as are situated in the County of Cumberland, and for such portions of the Police Districts of Camden and Narrellan as are situated in the County of Cumberland as described in the aforesaid Notice: on Friday, 7th November next.

At the Town of Liverpool, for such portion of the Police District of Parramatta as was formerly included and known as the Police District of Liverpool, and more particularly described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one: on Saturday, 8th November next.

At the Town of Parramatta and for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid notice, dated seventeenth January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, with the exception of that portion of the District by this Proclamation allotted to Liverpool: on Thursday, 30th October next.

At the Town of Windsor and for such portions of the Police District thereof, as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid notice: on Tuesday, 28th October next.

At the Town of Penrith and for such portions of the Police District thereof, as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid notice: on Monday, 27th October next.

It is to be understood that the Mails are to be despatched on the days and hours to be fixed by the Postmaster-General, either according to the present arrangement, or as he may afterwards determine for the public convenience.

It will be optional with parties to offer for one or more of the above lines of stages, and to propose the mode of conveyance; but on all roads where wheel vehicles can travel, a preference will be given to carriage conveyance, and the Contractors will be held strictly bound to use the conveyance they propose, and to travel at the rate agreed upon. The rate of travelling is not to be less than six miles per hour, including all stoppages. The Contractors are to carry all bags, letters, and newspapers which may be delivered to them under authority of the Postmaster-General, or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure lockers for the Mails in carriages and dry coverings for the bags on horseback.

Contractors will be bound to prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet, by any of their servants or passengers, or otherwise to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under penalty of £5. for each and every offence.

Contractors will be liable to a fine of five shillings for every five minutes delay after the specified time of starting; and to a like penalty for every ten minutes delay after the specified time of arrival, except for the first five or ten minutes respectively.

Contractors will be strictly bound not to assign any portion of their Contract without consent of the Postmaster-General.

A Mail Cart or Carriage, drawn only by one horse, must not carry more than one passenger; by two horses not more than three passengers; and by three or more horses, not more than six passengers, exclusive of the driver, under a penalty of £3 for each offence.

All vehicles and horses employed in the conveyance of Mails are to be at all times subject to the inspection and approval, or rejection of the Postmaster-General, or person appointed by him for that purpose.

The drivers and postmen are to be free men, and of certified good character.

All fines and penalties incurred under the agreement are to be deducted by the Postmaster-General, from the next quarterly instalment falling due to the Contractor, and to be considered as over and above any penalties provided by any Act of Council.

Each party tendering or an agent for him must attend at this Office on the day appointed for opening the Tenders; and each Tender must bear the signature of two respectable and solvent persons, engaging to enter into a bond with the Contractor, for the safety of the Mails, and the due performance of the Contract, and every stipulation therein.

The hours of starting from each Post Office or stage, and other particulars, may be ascertained at the General Post Office, where parties proposing to tender are invited to seek information.

Printed forms of Tender may be had on application at the General and all other Post Offices throughout the Colony.
