CONTRACTS FOR THE COLONIAL

this Ration is occasionally issued at Watchhouses to Prisoners of the Crown, when travelling from one station to another, and in other cases when sanctioned by a Magistrate.

- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap

6. The Ration to Children of Female Prisoners confined in Gaol :—

- 8 oz. best wheat bread
- 4 oz. fresh meat
- 1 pint milk
- $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. yellow soap

8. The Ration to Prisoners confined in Solitary cells or Watchhouses :—

- 24 oz. wheat bread, or
- 20 oz. flour

9. The Ration of Forage for Horses and Oxen :—

- 8lbs. maize or barley, or 10lbs. oats
- 4lbs. bran
- 12 lbs. oat, or cultivated grass hay
- 4lbs. wheat straw

for each horse daily, and half of these quantities for each bullock.

DISTRICTS.

The Districts for which Contracts will be required are as follows, viz. :—

The boundaries of the Districts are described in the Notice from this Office, dated 17th January, 1850.

The supplies for each District are intended to be included in one Contract, and therefore no Tenders can be considered unless for supplying the whole that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender, excepting Campbelltown, Camden and Narellan, and Picton, and Yass, Gunning, and Narrawa, for each of which places Tenders may be sent in separately.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, when forming part of the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, 10 per cent., and in all other cases, 20 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required for the Ration to Immigrants, and when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

5. The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

6. The Tobacco to be Colonial.

7. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz. :—1lb. wheat flour or 1lb biscuit equal to $1\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of bread; 12 oz. wheat flour equal to 1lb. maize meal; 8 oz. wheat flour equal to 1 pint of oatmeal; 1lb. salt beef, or 1lb. mutton, or 10 oz. salt pork, equal to 1lb. fresh beef; 1lb. coal equal to 3lbs. of firewood.

8. These substitutions are to be made only when required by the Officers authorised to draw the several Rations.

10. Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c., &c., except as otherwise provided for in Ration No. 1.

11. In case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, the several articles composing it are to be reckoned in the following proportions, and paid for accordingly, viz. :—

The maize or barley as 4-12; the hay as 5-12; the bran as 2-12; and the straw as 1-12 of the whole Ration respectively.

14. The supplies are to be delivered at the nearest station, on the requisition of the Officer in charge.

15. The Tenders for Provisions and Forage, when required by Rations, according to the scale under their respective heads, are to express the price per Ration only.

17. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the Service. But in Country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

18. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

19. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

20. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject, at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality—it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

21. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

22. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made.

23. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

ADDITIONAL GOLD REGULATIONS.

WITH reference to the Notices from this Office of the 23rd May and 4th August last, and pending the receipt of Instructions from Her Majesty's Government, His Excellency the Governor-General has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, to publish the following further provisional Regulations for the search of Gold.

1. Persons occupying portions of the Gold Field by erecting temporary buildings, tents, &c., and carrying on business in any way, shall pay a fee of thirty shillings monthly for the use of the land so occupied by them; and they are required to pay the same on demand, and in advance, to the Officer appointed to receive payment of License Fees.

2. Persons desirous of establishing claims to new and unoccupied ground by working in the ordinary method for alluvial Gold, may have their claims marked out on the following scale, namely:

- (1.) Fifteen feet frontage to either side of a river or main creek, to each person.
- (2.) Twenty feet of the bed of a tributary to a river or main creek, to each person.
- (3.) Sixty feet of the bed of a ravine or water-course, to each person.
- (4.) Twenty feet square of table land or river flats, to each person.

Every such claim shall be voided by the failure on the part of the claimant to work the same within ten days after the date of its acceptance; and persons found working on such or any other ground without having previously paid the License Fee to the proper Officer, shall pay double the amount for such License; and in default be proceeded against in the usual manner.

3. The License fee for private lands will in future be one-half only of that payable for Crown Lands.

4. Persons desirous of working Auriferous Quartz Veins may make application in writing to the Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner of the Gold District, accurately describing the locality. Such application shall be immediately recorded by such Officer in a book to be kept for that purpose, which shall be open at all reasonable times to the inspection of applicants. In case no previous application shall have been made as above directed, and should there be no valid objection to the proposal, the Commissioner shall notify to the applicant his acceptance of the same. The applicant shall then enter into a bond, binding himself and two or more sufficient sureties, to the satisfaction of the Government, jointly and severally, in the sum of two thousand pounds, to pay a Royalty of ten per cent. on all Gold obtained from any part of the land within the limits of his claim, to an Officer to be appointed for that purpose by the Government. He shall further be bound to permit such Officer to reside on the land in the neighbourhood of the works, at such spot as may be assigned by the Commissioner, and also to give to such Officer access at all reasonable times to the buildings or premises, and to all books and accounts connected with the production of Gold; also to give all necessary facilities for the collection of the Royalty daily or weekly as may be found most desirable.

5. All buildings, machinery, or other improvements, erected or made on the land, shall be considered as additional security for the due performance of the conditions of the bond.

6. The above claim shall consist of half a mile of, and in the course of, the vein, with fifty yards reserved on each side of such vein for building and other purposes. The right of cutting and using timber for building purposes or for firewood from adjacent Crown Lands, as well as access to neighbouring water, shall also be conceded. The duration of the claim shall be three years, which shall however be extended for such further period as upon receipt of instructions from Her Majesty's Government may be determined upon, having due regard to the interests of the parties concerned. At the expiration of the term of their holding, or on the sooner termination of their tenure by consent of the Government, the parties shall have liberty to remove all buildings, machinery, or other improvements erected or made by them, and a reasonable time shall be allowed for that purpose; provided always that the conditions of the Bond shall have been duly fulfilled.

7. A claim, such as the above, shall be forfeited by the failure of the applicant to enter within a reasonable period into the required bond;—by his neglecting to pay the prescribed Royalty, at the time and in the manner required by the bond;—by his not employing at least twenty persons on such claim within six months of the acceptance of his application for the same;—by his ceasing to employ that number of persons on the works for the period of one month thereafter;—by obstructing the Officer in the proper performance of his duty, or in any other way violating the terms of the bond. Such vein shall then be open to selection by other parties.

8. Persons desirous of working Auriferous Quartz Veins on their own lands, shall be subject to the terms of the above Regulations, with the exception that the Royalty payable on the gross production of Gold shall be five per cent., and that they shall not be compelled to employ any specific number of persons, nor be liable to any penalty on their ceasing to work.

9. Persons desirous of draining ponds or waterholes may make application in the mode above stated, to the Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner of the Gold District; and shall be subject, in all respects, to the same Regulations, with the exception that in the place of the payment of a Royalty, the applicants shall bind themselves to employ not less than forty persons for such undertaking during the period of their occupation, and take out a License for every person so employed; and such claim shall be voided by the withdrawal of such number of persons from the work, unless in case of interruption by flood or other unforeseen accident.

10. Where more than one application shall have been made for any pond or waterhole previously to the publication of these Regulations, or shall hereafter be made on the same day, such pond or waterhole shall be put up to Tender, the advance being on the existing rate of the License Fee. And it will be understood that such advance shall be paid on any number of persons employed in addition to the forty above determined.

The Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner is empowered to make such temporary regulation as may be necessary to prevent inconvenience to other licensed persons from the carrying on operations of the above nature.
