ROADS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make a Parish Road, to be maintained at the expense of the parishes through which it is to pass; commencing at the north-east corner of Hooke and Dowling-streets, in the Village of Dungog, and bearing north along Dowling-street 8 chains; thence north 40 degrees, east 3 chains, north 68 degrees 30 minutes, east 8 chains,

north 5 degrees, east 3 chains, and north 3 degrees, west 7 chains through the Village Reserve of Dungog, and C. L. Brown's and Laurence Myles's lands to the River Williams at the Port Stephen's Falls; thence in a north-easterly direction through Laurence Myles' land and the Church and School land to the present road to Stroud, from the upper falls of the River Williams at Dingadee: Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4th William IV, No. 11, intitled, "*An Act for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, and for opening and improving the Streets in the Towns thereof*," a plan and book of reference, shewing the intended line of the said road, is now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General in Sydney, and also at the Police Office, at Dungog; and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Road.

WOOLLOOMOOLOO BAY.

IT being deemed expedient that measures should be adopted for reclaiming the flat, below high water mark, at the head of Woolloomooloo Bay, and for forming a Wharf across it for the use of the public, as well as for extending the existing streets to the proposed Quay, and for proclaiming others along the Bay from east to west, His Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL directs it to be notified, that, to the proprietors of land having frontage to the Bay, it is proposed to concede portions of the reclaimed land, on condition of their filling up, at their own cost, to the contemplated line of wharf, and of their observing such conditions as may be imposed by the Corporate Authorities of Sydney for the construction of proper drains.

2. Proprietors of land in the locality in question are accordingly invited to inspect the plan, in conformity with which the land is to be reclaimed, at the Office of the Surveyor-General; and to signify, in writing, to the Colonial Secretary, within three months from this date, whether they desire to participate in the advantages arising from these measures, and are willing to abide by the conditions on which they can be extended to them.

CONTRACTS FOR THE COLONIAL SERVICE, FOR 1852.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Tenders will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock of Monday, the 17th November next, for furnishing, for the Colonial Service, in the several Districts, the supplies undermentioned, in such quantities as may be required from 1st January, 1852, to 31st March, 1853, upon the conditions hereafter specified.

PROVISIONS, AND OTHER ARTICLES.

1. The Ration to Immigrants :—*Male and Female Adults, of the age of 14 years and upwards,* daily—

- 16 oz. wheat bread
- 16 oz. fresh meat
- 16 oz. vegetables, the whole or a portion to consist of potatoes, at the option of the Agent for Immigration.

- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap

When required, 8oz. wheat bread may be substituted in lieu of vegetables, and 8oz. of oatmeal in lieu of meat.

One half of the above quantities to Children of Immigrants, under 14 years of age.

2. The Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, to Wardsmen in Gaol, to Prisoners detained as Witnesses or for want of bail, and to others in the employment of Colonial Departments, when authorised to receive it :—

this Ration is occasionally issued at Watchhouses to Prisoners of the Crown, when travelling from one station to another, and in other cases when sanctioned by a Magistrate.

- 8 oz. vegetables
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap

6. The Ration to Children of Female Prisoners confined in Gaol :—

- 8 oz. best wheat bread
- 4 oz. fresh meat
- 1 pint milk
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. yellow soap

8. The Ration to Prisoners confined in Solitary cells or Watchhouses :—

- 24 oz. wheat bread, or
- 20 oz. flour

9. The Ration of Forage for Horses and Oxen :—

- 8lbs. maize or barley, or 10lbs. oats
- 4lbs. bran
- 12 lbs. oat, or cultivated grass hay
- 4lbs. wheat straw

for each horse daily, and half of these quantities for each bullock.

DISTRICTS.

The Districts for which Contracts will be required are as follows, viz. :—

1, Liverpool; 2, Campbelltown, Camden, Narellan, and Picton; 3, Kiama; 4, Shoalhaven; 5, Goulburn; 6, Braidwood; 7, Moruya; 8, Yass, including Gunning and Narrawa; 9, Windsor; 10, Bathurst; 11, Sofala; 12, Orange; 13, Carcor; 14, Cooma; 15, Mudgee; 16, Rylstone; 17, Gosford; 18, Port Stephens; 19, Port Macquarie; 20, Eden; 21, McLeay River; 22, Grafton; 23, Ipswich; 24, Woogaroo.

The boundaries of the Districts are described in the Notice from this Office, dated 17th January, 1850.

The supplies for each District are intended to be included in one Contract, and therefore no Tenders can be considered unless for supplying the whole that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender, excepting Campbelltown, Camden and Narellan, and Picton, and Yass, Gunning, and Narrawa, for each of which places Tenders may be sent in separately.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, when forming part of the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, 10 per cent., and in all other cases, 20 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required for the Ration to Immigrants, and when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

5. The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

6. The Tobacco to be Colonial.

7. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz. :—1lb. wheat flour or 1lb. biscuit equal to $1\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of bread; 12 oz. wheat flour equal to 1lb. maize meal; 8 oz. wheat flour equal to 1 pint of oatmeal; 1lb. salt beef, or 1lb. mutton, or 10 oz. salt pork, equal to 1lb. fresh beef; 1lb. coal equal to 3lbs. of firewood.

8. These substitutions are to be made only when required by the Officers authorised to draw the several Rations.

10. Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c., &c., except as otherwise provided for in Ration No. 1.

11. In case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, the several articles composing it are to be reckoned in the following proportions, and paid for accordingly, viz. :—

The maize or barley as 4-12; the hay as 5-12; the bran as 2-12; and the straw as 1-12 of the whole Ration respectively.

14. The supplies are to be delivered at the nearest station, on the requisition of the Officer in charge.

15. The Tenders for Provisions and Forage, when required by Rations, according to the scale under their respective heads, are to express the price per Ration only.

16. The Tenders for Forage are not required to state the price of the Ration for Oxen, as when the latter is required, one half of the allowance fixed for Horses will be drawn, and one half the price allowed to the Contractor, whose engagement will be to provide for both Horses and Oxen.

17. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the Service. But in Country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

18. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

19. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

20. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject, at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality—it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

21. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

22. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made.

23. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

24. The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

25. Printed forms of Tender may be obtained at this Office, or from the Police Magistrates or Benches of the several Districts; and at the foot of every Tender, there must be a Memorandum, signed by the party tendering, and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be responsible for the due performance of the contract, in the event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking in that event, that they will severally execute and deliver, within one month from the usual notification of acceptance, a bond to Her Majesty, for securing such performance, otherwise such Tender will not be taken into consideration.

26. The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence at length.

27. Each Tender must be in the form referred to in paragraph 25, and enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "*Tender for provisions, &c.*"

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from any other cause, injury would be sustained either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or by the Contractor, by waiting for the decision of the arbitrators, the Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality—it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor-General, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which, it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

14. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made.

15. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor-General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.
