ROADS.

IS Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make a Parish Road, to be maintained at the expense of the parishes through which it is to pass; commencing at the north-east corner of Hooke and Dowling-streets, in the Village of Dungog, and bearing north along Dow-ling-street 8 chains; thence north 40 degrees, east 3 chains, north 68 degrees 30 minutes, east 8 chains,

north 5 degrees, east 3 chains, and north 3 degrees, west 7 chains through the Village Reserve of Dungog, and C. L. Brown's and Laurence Myles's lands to the River Williams at the Port Stephen's Falls; thence in a north-easterly direction through Laurence Myles' land and the Church and School land to the present road to Stroud, from the upper fails of the River Williams at Dingadee: Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4th William IV, No. 11, intituled, "An Act for making, altering, " and improving the Roads throughout the Colony " of New South Wales, and for opening and im-" proving the Streets in the Towns thereof," a plan and book of reference, shewing the intended line of the said road, is now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General in Sydney, and also at the Police Office, at Dungog; and all persons interested therein are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Road.

WOOLOOMOOLOO BAY.

Theing deemed expedient that measures should be adopted for reclaiming the flat, below high water mark, at the head of Wooloomooloo Bay, and for forming a Wharf across it for the use of the public, as well as for extending the existing streets to the proposed Quay, and for proclaiming others along the Bay from east to west, His Excellency the Governor-General directs it to be notified, that, to the proprietors of land having frontage to the Bay, it is proposed to concede portions of the reclaimed land, on condition of their filling up, at their own cost, to the contemplated line of wharf, and of their observing such conditions as may be imposed by the Corporate Authorities of Sydney for the construction of proper drains.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, when forming part of the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, 10 per cent., and in all other cases, 20 per cent, has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required for the Ration to Immigrants, and when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

5. The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to

the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

6. The Tobacco to be Colonial. 7. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz :- 1lb. wheat flour or 1lb biscuit equal to $1\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of bread; 12 oz. wheat flour equal to 1tb. maize meal; 8 oz. wheat flour equal to 1 pint of oatmeal; 11b. salt beef, or 11b. mutton, or 10 oz. salt pork, equal to 11b. fresh beef; 11b. coal equal to 3lbs. of firewood.

But in Country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as unpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

18. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense

charged to the Contractor.

19. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured,

and charged in like manner.

- 20. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject, at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality-it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.
- 21. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulet, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

22. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made.

23. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.
