PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, certain Waste Lands of the Crown, therein more particularly described, situated beyond the limits allotted for location, were erected into a separate District known as the LOWER DARLING DISTRICT; and whereas the boundaries of the said District, as set forth in the said Proclamation, were amended by a further Proclamation, bearing date the twelfth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one; and whereas it is expedient that the said District be divided into two Districts: Now, therefore, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor-General aforesaid, in virtue of the authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim that the beforementioned District of Lower Darling shall be, and is hereby divided into two Districts, to be called respectively the LOWER DARLING DISTRICT and the ALBERT DISTRICT, and that the following shall be the boundaries of the same respectively, that is to say:—

LOWER DARLING DISTRICT.

Bounded on the east, from Fort Bourke, by a line bearing south-easterly to the confluence of Kalingalungaguy Creek with the Lachlan River; on the south by the Lachlan, Murrumbidgee, and Murray Rivers, to the confluence of the Darling; and on the west and north-west by the River Darling to Fort Bourke aforesaid.

ALBERT DISTRICT.

Bounded on the west by a line due north from Chowella, Fowler's Station, on the River Murray, being the approximation to the one hundred and forty-first meridian of east longitude, to the thirtieth parallel of south latitude; on the north by that parallel easterly to the River Darling; on the south-east and east by that river downwards to the Murray; and on the south by the River Murray to Chowella aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this first day of November, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

HENRY DANGAR, 700, Seven hundred acres, county of Northumberland, parish of Wittingham; commencing at the north-west corner on the River Hunter, and bounded on the west by a line bearing south 99 chains; on the south by a line bearing east 80 chains; on the east by a line bearing north to Hunter's River; and on the north by that river westerly to the commencing north-west corner aforesaid.

Authorised for Henry Dangar, as a grant by Governor Macquarie, on the 7th September, 1821.

Quit Rent 2s. per 100 acres, commencing on 1st January, 1847.

CONTRACTS FOR THE COLONIAL
SERVICE, FOR 1852.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Tenders will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock of *Monday, the 17th November next*, for furnishing, for the Colonial Service, in the several Districts, the supplies undermentioned, in such quantities as may be required from 1st January, 1852, to 31st March, 1853, upon the conditions hereafter specified.

PROVISIONS, AND OTHER ARTICLES.

1. The Ration to Immigrants:—*Male and Female Adults, of the age of 14 years and upwards*, daily—

- 16 oz. wheat bread
- 16 oz. fresh meat
- 16 oz. vegetables, the whole or a portion to consist of potatoes, at the option of the Agent for Immigration.
- $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. tea
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap

When required, 8oz. wheat bread may be substituted in lieu of vegetables, and 8oz. of oatmeal in lieu of meat.

One half of the above quantities to Children of Immigrants, under 14 years of age.

2. The Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, to Wardsmen in Gaol, to Prisoners detained as Witnesses or for want of bail, and to others in the employment of Colonial Departments, when authorised to receive it:—

- 20 oz. wheat bread
- 8 oz. maize meal
- 16 oz. fresh meat
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt
- 1 oz. sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap

this Ration is occasionally issued at Watchhouses to Prisoners of the Crown, when travelling from one station to another, and in other cases when sanctioned by a Magistrate.

3. The Ration to Officers and Men of Surveying parties, when in the field, and to Officers and Men of Mounted parties, entitled to receive it:—

- 24 oz. flour
- 16 oz. fresh meat
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tea
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz. sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. tobacco
- $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. soap

4. The Ration to Prisoners sentenced to imprisonment and hard labor in Gaols:—

- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap

5. The Ration to other Prisoners confined in Gaol, and not in cells:—

- 12 oz. wheat bread
- 12 oz. maize meal
- 4 oz. fresh meat
- 8 oz. vegetables
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. soap

6. The Ration to Children of Female Prisoners confined in Gaol:—

- 8 oz. best wheat bread
- 4 oz. fresh meat
- 1 pint milk
- $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. yellow soap

8. The Ration to Prisoners confined in Solitary cells or Watchhouses:—

- 24 oz. wheat bread, or
- 20 oz. flour

9. The Ration of Forage for Horses and Oxen:—

- 8lbs. maize or barley, or 10lbs. oats
- 4lbs. bran
- 12 lbs. oat, or cultivated grass hay
- 4lbs. wheat straw

for each horse daily, and half of these quantities for each bullock.

11. Fuel and Light:—

- Firewood, per 100lbs.
- Coals, per ton, where they can be supplied at a cheaper rate than firewood.
- Sperm oil, per imperial gallon
- Common oil, per imperial gallon
- Mould candles, per lb
- Dipt candles, per lb

DISTRICTS.

The Districts for which Contracts will be required are as follows, viz:—

1, Liverpool; 2, Campbelltown, Camden, Narellan, and Picton; 3, Kiama; 4, Shoalhaven; 5, Goulburn; 6, Braidwood; 7, Moruya; 8, Yass, including Gunning and Narrawa; 9, Windsor; 10, Bathurst; 11, Sofala; 12, Orange; 13, Ophir; 14, Carew; 15, Cooma; 16, Mudgee; 17, Rylstone; 18, Gosford; 19, Port Stephens; 20, Port Macquarie; 21, Eden; 22, McLeay River; 23, Grafton; 24, Ipswich; 25, Woogaroo.

The boundaries of the Districts are described in the Notice from this Office, dated 17th January, 1850.

The supplies for each District are intended to be included in one Contract, and therefore no Tenders can be considered unless for supplying the whole that may be required in the entire of a District, and for each District there must be a separate Tender, excepting Campbelltown, Camden and Narellan, and Picton, and Yass, Gunning, and Narrawa, for each of which places Tenders may be sent in separately.

CONDITIONS.

1. All the articles required by this notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Flour and Bread must be the produce of clean sound Colonial wheat, from which, when forming part of the Ration to Prisoners of the Crown, 10 per cent., and in all other cases, 20 per cent. has been extracted in bran and waste.

3. Beef and Mutton to be issued in such proportions as may be required for the Ration to Immigrants, and when the quantity admits of it, this, as well as the Convict Ration of Beef to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately.

5. The Maize Meal to be similar in quality to the Wheat Meal, and to be twice ground.

6. The Tobacco to be Colonial.

7. When it may be necessary to substitute one article for another, the following proportions are to be observed, viz.:—1lb. wheat flour or 1lb. biscuit equal to $1\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of bread; 12 oz. wheat flour equal to 1lb. maize meal; 8 oz. wheat flour equal to 1 pint of oatmeal; 1lb. salt beef, or 1lb. mutton, or 10 oz. salt pork, equal to 1lb. fresh beef; 1lb. coal equal to 3lbs. of firewood.

8. These substitutions are to be made only when required by the Officers authorised to draw the several Rations.

10. Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c., &c., except as otherwise provided for in Ration No. 1.

11. In case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, the several articles composing it are to be reckoned in the following proportions, and paid for accordingly, viz. :—

The maize or barley as 4-12; the hay as 5-12; the bran as 2-12; and the straw as 1-12 of the whole Ration respectively.

14. The supplies are to be delivered at the nearest station, on the requisition of the Officer in charge.

15. The Tenders for Provisions and Forage, when required by Rations, according to the scale under their respective heads, are to express the price per Ration only.

16. The Tenders for Forage are not required to state the price of the Ration for Oxen, as when the latter is required, one half of the allowance fixed for Horses will be drawn, and one half the price allowed to the Contractor, whose engagement will be to provide for both Horses and Oxen.

17. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the Government, according to the practice of the Service. But in Country districts, where such a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, the party objecting will name one person as arbitrator, the Contractor or his agent another, and these two will (previously to any other proceeding on their part) concur in naming a third as umpire, who, in the event of the arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final.

18. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

19. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

20. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject, at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality—it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it will be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

21. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

22. It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made.

23. The Contractor will be required to prepare his own cash account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state to the Officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Auditor General, in order that a warrant may be prepared and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

24. The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

25. Printed forms of Tender may be obtained at this Office, or from the Police Magistrates or Benches of the several Districts; and at the foot of every Tender, there must be a Memorandum, signed by the party tendering, and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be responsible for the due performance of the contract, in the event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking in that event, that they will severally execute and deliver, within one month from the usual notification of acceptance, a bond to Her Majesty, for securing such performance, otherwise such Tender will not be taken into consideration.

26. The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence at length.

27. Each Tender must be in the form referred to in paragraph 25, and enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "*Tender for provisions, &c.*"

28. Further particulars and information may be obtained on application at this Office, to the Auditor General, and to the several Police Magistrates or Benches.

29. The Party tendering, or an Agent authorised in writing to act for him, is requested to attend at this Office, at the time appointed for receiving the Tenders, to afford such explanation or information as may be required.

A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

WOOLLOOMOOLOO BAY.
