WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE RATES AT THE CIRCULAR WHARF.

AT Twelve o'clock on Wednesday, the 17th day of December next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to Auction, at the Court of Requests, Bent-street, Sydney, the Lease for one year, commencing the 1st day of January, 1852, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates payable at the Circular Wharf, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 10 Victoria, No. 11.

**TWENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**
