18. If the Board, arbitrators, or umpire shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which, it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense

charged to the Contractor.

19. In the event of any unnecessary delay, or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured, and charged in like manner.

- 20. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause injury would be sustained, either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the Department, or Officer in charge of the party or parties for whom the Rations are to be received, shall have power to reject, at the place of delivery, such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality-it being distinctly understood, that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Contractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the meantime, he must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing of which it wil be obtained by the Officer or party requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.
- 21. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivery or replacing them when required, will also subject the Contractor, upon the report of the Officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulet, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor-General may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the Contract forthwith.

22. WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE RATES AT THE CIRCULAR WHARF.

A T Twelve o'clock on Wednesday, the 17th day of December next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to Auction, at the Court of Requests, Bent-street, Sydney, the Lease for on-year, commencing the 1st day of January, 1852, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates payable at the Circular Wharf, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 10 Victoria, No. 11.

The Lessee will be entitled to the free use of the Wharf, at which he may be authorised to collect Dues for depositing goods thereon, either for shipment or discharge, as well as for all other purposes appertaining to a wharf.

The entire use of the large Shed will be allowed to the Lessee of the Rates to be received at that

The use of the Wharf will be reserved as a public thoroughfure, or for the landing or embarkation of passengers and other persons at the same, free of any charge whatsoever, and the steps will have to be kept free from all ships' or vessels' warps, hawsers, cables, or goods.
