## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS the boundaries of the Pastoral Districts of LIVERPOOL PLAINS, BLIGH, WELLINGTON, GWYDIR, and MARANOA were respectively set forth and described in the Proclamations bearing date the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and the seventh day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight: And whereas it is expedient to establish other boundaries in lieu thereof: Now, therefore I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor-General aforesaid, in virtue of the authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim, that the following shall be the boundaries of the said Districts respectively, that is to say:—

### LIVERPOOL PLAINS DISTRICT.

Bounded on the north by the range dividing the waters of the River Gwydir from those of the River Namoi or Peel from Pockataroo, separating this District from the Gwydir District; on the east by the fall at the western extreme of the table land, separating this District from that of New England; on the south by the Liverpool Range, separating this District from the Counties of Durham, Brisbane, and Bligh; on the west by the Warrabangle Range and the Range dividing the waters of the Castlereagh and Namoi Rivers to the confluence of Pian Creek, and thence by a line bearing due north till it is cut by a line from Pockataroo to the Rocky Ford on the Narran, in latitude 29 degrees 20 minutes south, and

separating this District from that of Bligh; and again on the north by the last described line to Pockataroo aforesaid.

### BLIGH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the east by the County of Bligh, by the Warrabangle Range and the range dividing the waters of the Castlereagh and Namoi Rivers, to the confluence of the Pian Creek with the Barwon; and thence by a line bearing due north till it is cut by a line from Pockataroo, to the Rocky Ford on the Narran in latitude 29 degrees 20 minutes south, and separating this District from that of Liverpool Plains; on the north by the last described line and its westerly prolongation till it is cut by a line bearing due north from the confluence of the Bokhara River with the Barwon, and separating this District from that of Gwydir; on the west by the last described line to the Barwon River; by that river upwards to the confluence of the River Macquarie and by the Macquarie; and on the south by the River Macquarie, separating this District from that of Wellington, to the County of Bligh aforesaid.

### WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

Bounded on the east by the Counties of Bathurst and Wellington by the River Macquarie to the Barwon, and by the Barwon River to the confluence of the Bokhara River; thence by a line bearing due north till it is cut by the prolongation of a line from Pockataroo to the Rocky Ford on the Narran in latitude 29 degrees 20 minutes south, and separating this District from that of Bligh; on the north by the last described line till it meets Mr. Kennedy's return track from the River Warrego; by that track to the twenty-ninth parallel of south latitude, and by that parallel to the River Warrego, and separating this District from that of Gwydir; on the west

by the River Warrego downwards to the thirtieth parallel of south latitude; on the south by that parallel to the River Darling or Barwon; again on the west by that river downwards to Fort Bourke; and thence by a line to the confluence of Kalingalungaguy Creek with the Lachlan River, and separating this District from the Lower Darling District; and again on the south by the River Lachlan, separating this District from that of Lachlan to the county of Bathurst aforesaid.

#### GWYDIR DISTRICT.

Bounded on the west by the River Warrego downwards, from where the twenty-eighth parallel of south latitude meets it, to where the twenty-ninth parallel meets it; on the south by the twenty-ninth parallel to where it is cut by Mr. Kennedy's return track from the River Warrego, and by that track to where the prolongation of a line from Pockataroo to the Rocky Ford on the Narran, in latitude 29 degrees 20 minutes south cuts it, and by that line to Pockataroo, thence by the range dividing the waters of the River Gwydir from those of the River Namoi or Peel, and separating this district from those of Wellington, Bligh, and Liverpool Plains; on the east by the fall of the western extreme of the table land, separating this district from that of New England; and on the north by a line west from Mount Gerard, and by the Barwon River (known also as the Karaula or Macintyre) downwards to where the surveyed and marked track from the Balonne crosses it, at a tree marked No. 87; thence by that track to Johnston's station (called Cuningundi), on the Mooni River; thence by a line to Camp 1 on the Culgoa (2nd and 3rd April, 1846), by the same line prolonged till it cuts the twenty-eighth parallel of south latitude, and by that parallel westerly to the River Warrego aforesaid, and separating this district from those of Darling Downs and Maranoa.

#### MARANOA DISTRICT.

Bounded on the south by the Barwon River, (known also as the Karaula or Macintyre) downwards to where the surveyed and marked track from the Balonne crosses it, at a tree marked No. 87; thence by that track to Johnston's station, (called Cuningundi,) on the Mooni River, thence by a line to Camp 1 on the Culgoa, (2nd and 3rd April, 1846,) by the same line prolonged till it cuts the twenty-eighth parallel of south latitude, and by that parallel westerly to the River Warrego, and separating this district from the Gwydir district; on the west by the River Warrego upwards to the confluence of Cummo Creek, and by that Creek to its source near Mount Playfair; on the north by the northern watershed of the Rivers Warrego, Maranoa, and Balonne, or Condamine, to the source of Tanning Creek; on the east by Tanning Creek to Dogwood Creek, and by Dogwood Creek to its confluence with the Balonne, and thence by a line south by compass to the Barwon River aforesaid, and separating this district from that of Darling Downs.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales, after the separation of the District of Port Phillip therefrom, into Electoral Districts, and for the election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council*," provision is made, in the event of the establishment of any new Pastoral District, or of any addition to any existing Pastoral District, forming an Electoral District, or part of an Electoral District, under the provisions of the said Act, for the annexation of such new Pastoral District, or addition to a Pastoral District, to any one of the Electoral Districts named in the said Act, to which such new District, or addition to a District, may be contiguous: And whereas the Crown Lands comprised within the limits hereinafter set forth, have been respectively annexed to the existing Pastoral Districts of Maranoa, Gwydir, Wellington, and Bligh respectively, and it is expedient that the said Crown Lands should be added to the Electoral Districts to which such additions to the existing Pastoral Districts aforesaid are respectively contiguous: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, as such Governor aforesaid, do by this my Proclamation, for that purpose issued, with the advice of the Executive Council, notify that the Crown Lands aforesaid have been added to the Electoral Districts contiguous thereto, in the manner following, that is to say:—

*To the Electoral District of the United Pastoral Districts of Moreton, Wide Bay, Burnett and Maranoa, the portion of additional Territory annexed to the Pastoral District of Maranoa,—*

Bounded on the south by a line from Johnston's station (called Cuningundi) on the Mooni River, to Camp 1 on the Culgoa (2nd and 3rd April, 1846,) by the same line, prolonged till it cuts the twenty-eighth parallel of south latitude, and by that parallel westerly to the River Warrego; on the west by the River Warrego upwards to the confluence of Cummo Creek, and by that creek to its source near Mount Playfair; on the north by the northern watershed of the Rivers Warrego, Maranoa, and Balonne or Condamine to the source of Tanning Creek; on the east by Tanning Creek to a point east by compass from the highest summit of the Grafton Range, thence on the south by a line to that summit, thence by a line across the Fitz Roy Downs to Mount Beagle, thence by a line across the same downs to Mount Bindango, and thence by the River Amby to its confluence with the River Maranoa; on the east by the Maranoa to the Balonne, and by the Balonne to St. George's Bridge, thence by the surveyed and marked track to the River Mooni, and by the Mooni downwards to Cuningundi aforesaid.

*To the Electoral District of the United Pastoral Districts of Liverpool Plains and Gwydir, the portion of additional Territory annexed to the Pastoral District of Gwydir,—*

Bounded on the north by a line from Johnston's station (called Cuningundi) on the Mooni River, to Camp 1 on the Culgoa, (2nd and 3rd April, 1846,) by the same line prolonged till it cuts the

twenty-eighth parallel of south latitude, and by that parallel westerly to the River Warrego; on the west by the River Warrego downwards, to where the twenty-ninth parallel of south latitude meets it; thence on the south by that parallel to where it is cut by Mr. Kennedy's return track from the River Warrego, and by that track to where the prolongation of a line from Pockataroo, to the Rocky Ford on the Narran, in latitude twenty-nine degrees twenty minutes south cuts it, and thence by that line to Pockataroo; and thence on the east by the Barwon and Mooni Rivers to Cunninghamdi aforesaid.

*To the Electoral District of the United Pastoral Districts of Wellington and Bligh, the portion of additional Territory annexed to the Pastoral District of Wellington,—*

Bounded on the east by a line bearing due north from the confluence of the Bokhara River with the Barwon till it is cut by the prolongation of a line from Pockataroo to the Rocky Ford on the Narran in latitude 29 degrees 20 minutes; on the north by the last described line till it meets Mr. Kennedy's Return Track from the River Warrego, by that track to the twenty-ninth parallel of south latitude, and by that parallel to the River Warrego; on the west by the River Warrego downwards, to the thirtieth parallel of south latitude; and on the south by that parallel to the River Darling or Barwon, and by that river to the confluence of the Bokhara River aforesaid.

*And the portion of additional Territory annexed to the Pastoral District of Bligh,—*

Bounded on the east by a line bearing due north from the confluence of Pian Creek with the Barwon River, till it is cut by a line from Pockataroo to the Rocky Ford, on the Narran, in latitude 29 degrees 20 minutes south; on the north by the last described line and its westerly prolongation, till it is cut by a line bearing due north from the confluence of the Bokhara River with the Darling or Barwon; on the west by the last described line to the Barwon River; and on the south by the Barwon to the confluence of Pian Creek aforesaid.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws for the transportation and punishment of offenders in New South Wales, and for defining the respective powers and authorities of General Quarter Sessions and of Petty Sessions, and for determining the places at which the same shall be holden, and*

*for better regulating the summary jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace, and for repealing certain laws and ordinances relating thereto,"* it was, amongst other things enacted, that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions for the said Colony, should be holden at such times respectively, as the Governor for the time being should by any Proclamation duly issued for that purpose, appoint: Now, I, the Governor-General, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that the said Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden during the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, at the several times and places herein-after respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At Maitland, on Monday, the 5th of January, the 12th of April, the 26th of July, and the 4th of October.

At Bathurst, on Thursday, the 22nd of January, the 22nd of April, the 15th of July, and the 21st of October.

At Sydney, on Tuesday, the 10th of February, and Monday, the 10th of May, the 9th of August, and the 8th of November; and also by adjournments of such Sessions respectively, on Monday, the 8th of March, the 14th of June, the 27th of September, and the 13th of December.

At Parramatta, on Tuesday, the 17th of February, the 18th of May, the 17th of August, and the 16th of November.

At Goulburn, on Thursday, the 18th of March, and the 24th of June, and on Monday, the 13th of September, and Thursday, the 23rd of December.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland,"* it was, amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its dependencies, and at such places respectively as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint; And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, in the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke*" respectively," it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established or to be established within

the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine in a summary way all actions whatsoever for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds: Now, I, the said Governor-General, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests in and for the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, shall be holden during the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, at the times and places, and for the districts, hereafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—The Ordinary Sittings of the Court of Requests for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds for the City of Sydney and for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, shall commence and be holden on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, viz.:—Monday, 12th January; Monday, 2nd February; Monday, 1st March; Thursday, 1st April; Monday, 3rd May; Tuesday, 1st June; Monday, 5th July; Monday, 2nd August; Wednesday, 1st September; Monday, 11th October; Monday, 1st November; and Wednesday, 1st December, respectively.

The "New Sittings" of the said Court for the trial of all causes from ten to thirty pounds, for the said City and Police District thereof, as aforesaid, shall commence and be holden on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day, as may be found necessary, viz.:—Friday, 16th January; Friday, 6th February; Friday, 5th March; Monday, 5th April; Friday, 7th May; Monday, 7th June; Friday, 9th July; Friday, 6th August; Monday, 6th September; Friday, 15th October; Friday, 5th November; and Monday, 6th December, respectively.

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the said Courts for the other Districts in the County of Cumberland, will commence on the undermentioned dates; and the "New Sittings" of the Courts for these Districts respectively, shall commence after the termination of the "Ordinary Sittings," and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, that is to say:—

At the Town of Campbell-Town and for such portions of the Police District thereof, as are situated in the County of Cumberland, and for such portions of the Police Districts of Camden and Narellan, as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid notice: On Wednesday, 24th March; Wednesday, 30th June; Monday, 20th September; and Wednesday, 29th December, respectively.

At the Town of Liverpool, for such portion of the Police District of Parramatta as was formerly included and known as the Police District of Liverpool, and more particularly described in a certain Notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one:—on Thursday, 25th March; Thursday, 1st July; Tuesday, 21st September; and Thursday, 30th December respectively.

At the Town of Parramatta and for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid

Notice, dated 17th January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, with the exception of that portion of the district by this Proclamation allotted to Liverpool, on Friday, 20th February; Friday, 21st May; Friday, 20th August; and Friday, 19th November respectively.

At the Town of Penrith, and for such portions of the Police District thereof, as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid Notice, on Friday, 30th January; Friday, 30th April; Friday, 23rd July; and Friday, 29th October respectively.

**WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE RATES AT THE CIRCULAR WHARF.**

**A**T Twelve o'clock on Wednesday, the 17th day of December next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to Auction, at the Court of Requests, Bent-street, Sydney, the Lease for one year, commencing the 1st day of January 1852, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates payable at the Circular Wharf, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 10 Victoria, No. 11.

The Lessee will be entitled to the free use of the Wharf, at which he may be authorised to collect Dues for depositing goods thereon, either for shipment or discharge, as well as for all other purposes appertaining to a wharf.

The entire use of the large Shed will be allowed to the Lessee of the Rates to be received at that wharf.
