**I**N pursuance of the power and authority in me, in this behalf, vested, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor-General and Governor in Chief aforesaid, do, by this Proclamation, made and issued by me, with the advice of the Executive Council of the Colony of New South Wales, ordain and appoint, that the days on which the Circuit Courts in the said Colony shall hereafter commence to be holden, shall be the days severally hereinafter mentioned, instead of the days heretofore appointed, that is to say:—

- At Goulburn, on the second Monday in the months of February and August.
- At Bathurst, on Thursday, in the week then next following.
- At Maitland, on the Monday week next following that Thursday.
- And at Brisbane, on the third Monday in the months of May and November.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws for the transportation and punishment of offenders in New South Wales, and for defining the respective powers and authorities of General Quarter Sessions and of Petty Sessions, and for determining the places at which the same shall be holden, and for better regulating the summary jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace, and for repealing certain laws and ordinances relating thereto," it was, amongst other things enacted, that the Courts of General Quarter Sessions for the said Colony, should be holden at such times respectively, as the Governor for the time being should by any Proclamation duly issued for that purpose, appoint: Now, I, the Governor-General, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that the said Courts of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden during the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, at the several times and places hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

At Maitland, on Monday, the 5th of January, the 12th of April, the 26th of July, and the 4th of October.

At Bathurst, on Thursday, the 22nd of January, the 22nd of April, the 15th of July, and the 21st of October.

At Sydney, on Tuesday, the 10th of February, and Monday, the 10th of May, the 9th of August, and the 8th of November; and also by adjournments of such Sessions respectively, on Monday, the 8th of March, the 14th of June, the 27th of September, and the 13th of December.

At Parramatta, on Tuesday, the 17th of February, the 18th of May, the 17th of August, and the 16th of November.

At Goulburn, on Thursday, the 18th of March, and the 24th of June, and on Monday, the 13th of September, and Thursday, the 23rd of December.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland*," it was, amongst other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for

such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its dependencies, and at such places respectively as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint; And whereas by another Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, in the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke respectively,*" it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established or to be established within the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine in a summary way all actions whatsoever for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds: Now, I, the said Governor-General, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint that Courts of Requests in and for the City of Sydney and County of Cumberland, shall be holden during the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, at the times and places, and for the districts, hereafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—The Ordinary Sittings of the Court of Requests for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds for the City of Sydney and for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the seventeenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and published in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, shall commence and be holden on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, viz:—Monday, 12th January; Monday, 2nd February; Monday, 1st March; Thursday, 1st April; Monday, 3rd May; Tuesday, 1st June; Monday, 5th July; Monday, 2nd August; Wednesday, 1st September; Monday, 11th October; Monday, 1st November; and Wednesday, 1st December, respectively.

The "New Sittings" of the said Court for the trial of all causes from ten to thirty pounds, for the said City and Police District thereof, as aforesaid, shall commence and be holden on the following days, and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day, as may be found necessary, viz:—Friday, 16th January; Friday, 6th February; Friday, 5th March; Monday, 5th April; Friday, 7th May; Monday, 7th June; Friday, 9th July; Friday, 6th August; Monday, 6th September; Friday, 15th October; Friday, 5th November; and Monday, 6th December, respectively.

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the said Courts for the other Districts in the County of Cumberland, will commence on the undermentioned dates; and the "New Sittings" of the Courts for these Districts respectively, shall commence after the termination of the "Ordinary Sittings," and shall respectively be continued by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary, that is to say:—

#### MEASUREMENT OF RUNS OBTAINED BY TENDER.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to establish the following Regulations in regard to the measurement of Runs of Crown Lands beyond the Settled Districts, obtained by Tender under the provisions of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, namely:—

#### NEW RUNS.

1. The principle which, according to existing Regulations is applicable to Runs that were under licensed occupation previously to the promulgation in the Colony of the Order in Council, will be extended to New Runs *heretofore* obtained by Tender under the provisions thereof, that is to say, in any case where the Tenderer has set forth in his Tender, a clear description of the Run for which he applied, and of the boundaries of the same, as required by the 13th section of Cap. 11 of the Order in Council, he will not be expected to be at the cost of measurement; but in every case in which the description furnished by the Tenderer is insufficient for purposes of identity, the Run will be measured at his cost previously to the issue of the Lease. The measurement, if effected by a private Surveyor, will be subject to the approval of the Government, and if by a Government Surveyor, will be charged for at the rate laid down in the Notice of 1st January, 1850, namely:—ten shillings per linear mile.

2. In every case of a new Run hereafter to be tendered for, the Tenderer will be required to procure a measured description at his own cost, in the manner last described before the issue of the Lease.

#### ADJUSTED, VACATED, OR FORFEITED RUNS.

3. Adjusted, vacated, or forfeited Runs, will also require to be measured before the issue of the Lease; but as in cases of this kind the descriptions according to which the Tenders have been made, were prepared or adopted by the Government, the measurement will be effected at the public cost, as well with respect to past as to future cases of the kind.

4. In future all adjusted, vacated, or forfeited Runs, will be properly measured before they are offered for public competition.
