PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor-General of all Her Majesty's Australian Possessions, and Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the Third year of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intitled "*An Act for subjecting vessels coming to New South Wales, from certain places, to the performance of Quarantine*," it was amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time as he may think fit and expedient, by any order or orders notified by Proclamation, to appoint certain stations or places within the harbour of Port Jackson, or within or near any other harbour or place within the said Colony, for the performance of Quarantine, under the said recited Act, where all vessels liable to Quarantine, and the crews, passengers and persons on board thereof, shall perform the same, and also, if necessary to appoint Lazarets and other places where the crews, passengers, and other persons, and the goods, wares, and merchandise, which shall or may be on board the said vessels, shall and may be detained and kept for the performance of Quarantine: Now, I, the Governor-General and Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, declare and order that Nobby Island, within or near the harbour or roadstead of Newcastle, "bounded on the south-east,

"east, and north by the South Pacific Ocean; "on the west by the waters of Port Hunter; and "on the south-west by the northern termination of "the Newcastle Breakwater," shall be a station and place for the performance of Quarantine, according to the several provisions of the said recited Act, and subject to the several rules, regulations, and restrictions contained therein, and in any order or orders which shall or may be made by me, with the advice of the Executive Council, concerning Quarantine and the prevention of infection; and I do hereby strictly prohibit all persons, not being themselves under Quarantine, or duly authorised for the purposes of necessary communication with vessels under Quarantine, or with the Quarantine ground, from going, under any pretence whatever, within the limits of the said Nobby Island, as the same are hereinbefore described, when any ship or vessel is performing Quarantine thereat, or any persons, goods, wares, or merchandise are undergoing Quarantine on shore within the said limits, under the pains and penalties prescribed by law.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-fifth day of November, in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's reign, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL Persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the amount of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

4. They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward accounts of all the expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor-General, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

PORTION OF DIRECT ROAD TO ILLAWARRA, BETWEEN GEORGE'S RIVER AND MADDEN'S PLAINS.

COURTS OF REQUESTS.

THE following additional Rules of practice and proceeding for the conduct of business in the Courts of Requests for the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland, have been settled by me, with the assistance of the Commissioner of the Courts of Requests for the City and County aforesaid, pursuant to the Act of Council 6 Victoria, No. 15.

65. The 56th Rule of Practice is hereby repealed.

66. In all cases for the City of Sydney, and District thereof, where the claim does not exceed £10, the plaint shall be entered at least eight days, and the summons issuing therefrom be served four clear days prior to the Court day; if elsewhere within the County of Cumberland, such plaint shall be entered at least ten days, and the summons issuing therefrom, be served six clear days prior to the sittings of the respective Courts. And in all cases where the claim shall exceed £10, the plaints at Sydney and elsewhere shall be entered at least ten days, and the summons issuing therefrom, be served at least eight clear days prior to the Court day.
