LL Persons having clams on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

They will also, as soon as practicable after the close of the year, bring forward accounts of all the expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month

after its termination.

5. The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor-General, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.
