## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to extend the provisions of an Act passed in the eleventh year of Her present Majesty, intituled, 'An Act for the regulation of Steam Navigation, and for requiring 'sea-going vessels to carry boats, to all Steam Vessels,'*" it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the said Governor to extend the said Act to such parts and places in the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies, as he, from time to time, should think fit, by Proclamation in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*; and whereas it appears to me fit and proper that the said Act should be henceforth extended to the parts and places hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act be extended to the Harbour and Port of Moreton Bay, and to the Rivers in the County or reputed County of Stanley, in the said Colony, and other waters adjacent to this Harbour and Port.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Sydney, this twenty-first day of February, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

## FAMILIES OF CONVICTS.

REFERRING to the notice from this Office, dated 27th August, 1847, in which it was intimated that Her Majesty's Government had determined to revive the practice of forwarding to this Colony at the public expense, the wives and families of married Convicts who had become free by Pardon or otherwise, or had obtained Tickets of Leave, and who were recommended as worthy of that indulgence; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Her Majesty's Government have seen fit so far to modify the Regulation on this head, as to direct that in all future cases, only one half the expense of conveying the wife and family of a Convict to this Colony shall be defrayed by the public, leaving the other moiety to be met from private sources.

2. As, however, it will not be possible to pre-determine the actual expense of providing passages for each such family, the applicants will be required to deposit in the Colony, such a sum of money as will cover one moiety of the probable expense, calculated according to the following scale, and the balance (if any) after paying a moiety of the actual expense incurred, will be returned to the parties, namely :—
