PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled, "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land," and in pursuance of the power delegated to me by Her Majesty in that behalf, I did, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Colony, appoint certain persons to be Members of the Legislative Council by the said Act established, as more fully set forth in my Proclamation bearing date the 8th day of December, 1848; and whereas Major-General Edward Buckley Wynyard, Companion of the Most Honorable Military Order of the Bath, one of the persons named in such Letters Patent and Proclamation respectively, hath, by a writing under his hand, addressed to me, resigned his seat in the said Legislative Council: Now, therefore, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim, that, in pursuance of the authority in me vested, I have, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Colony, bearing even date herewith, appointed WILLIAM MONTAGU MANNING, Esquire, to be a Member of the said Legislative Council, in the place of the said Major-General Edward Buckley Wynyard, until Her Majesty's pleasure shall be known.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-seventh day of February, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

FAMILIES OF CONVICTS.

REFERRING to the notice from this Office, dated 27th August, 1847, in which it was intimated that Her Majesty's Government had determined to revive the practice of forwarding to this Colony at the public expense, the wives and families of married Convicts who had become free by Pardon or otherwise, or had obtained Tickets of Leave, and who were recommended as worthy of that indulgence; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Her Majesty's Government have seen fit so far to modify the Regulation on this head, as to direct that in all future cases, only one half the expense of conveying the wife and family of a Convict to this Colony shall be defrayed by the public, leaving the other moiety to be met from private sources.

2. As, however, it will not be possible to pre-determine the actual expense of providing passages for each such family, the applicants will be required to deposit in the Colony, such a sum of money as will cover one moiety of the probable expense, calculated according to the following scale, and the balance (if any) after paying a moiety of the actual expense incurred, will be returned to the parties, namely:—

COTTON.

(PREMIUM FOR CULTIVATION.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that, with a view to encourage the cultivation of Cotton in New South Wales, the following sums have been voted by the Legislative Council to be given as premiums for the best samples of that article grown in any part of the Colony, and exhibited in Sydney, on or before the 1st of June, 1851, viz:—

- 1st.—For the best sample of Cotton Wool, weighing not less than 50lbs. £30
- 2nd.—For the second best sample, weighing not less than 50lbs. £20

The particular qualities required are length, strength, fineness, and silkiness of staple, and brightness of color.

Proof will be required that the Cotton Wool exhibited is the produce of the Colony, by the certificate of a Magistrate, or of some other known person of respectability.

The samples are to be delivered at the Colonial Store at Sydney, and the awards will be made by a Board appointed by the Governor.
