TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-DITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on or about the night of the 19th December last, the hut, woolshed, and hurdles, of Λlexander Robertson, Esq., at Hillside, Hovell's Creek, in the district of Carcoar, were maliciously destroyed by fire, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty pounds will be paid to any free person who may, within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the guilty parties; or if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon.
