ADJUSTED NEW RUNS.

IT is hereby notified, that Tenders having been received for the undermentioned New Runs of Crown Land, the boundaries of which required to be adjusted so as to exclude lands already under lease or promise of lease, or applied for by other parties, sealed Tenders, in the prescribed printed form, will be received at this Office until noon of Monday, the 2nd day of June next, from the previous applicants, and from any other persons desirous to enter into competition with them, for the purchase of the lease of any one of the said Runs, according to the amended descriptions hereto annexed.

2. Every such Tender must state the term of years, (not exceeding fourteen if in an Unsettled District, or eight if in an Intermediate District) for which it is proposed to take the Run; and whether in addition to the minimum rent required by Her Majesty's Order in Council, it is intended to offer any, and if any, what amount of *yearly* premium, per thousand sheep or equivalent number of cattle, for the lease.

3. As the grazing capabilities of these Runs have not yet been determined, it will be necessary that each Tender contain an estimate of the number of sheep or cattle that the Run will carry.

4. Until the Runs have been regularly surveyed, and their grazing capabilities determined, the future lessees will be required to pay rent according to their own estimates as given in the Tenders; and in the event of the rent so paid proving to have been less than that determined by valuation, they will be required to make up the difference previously to the execution of the leases.

5. It is also to be distinctly understood, that the Government reserves to itself the right of excluding from the lease of any of these Runs, any land which it may be deemed proper to reserve for any of the purposes referred to in the 9th section of chapter II. of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated 9th March, 1847.

6. A separate Tender must be made for each separate Run.

MARANOA DISTRICT.

1.—A block of land called Combarngo, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Having 5 miles frontage by estimate on the Ballonne River, bounded on the west by the eastern boundary of the run applied for by Mr. Thomas Hall, called Bambilla; on the north by a line running easterly about 5 miles to the western boundary of the run applied for by Mr. Lang, called Horsetrack Creek; and thence on the east by that boundary to the Balonne River.

9.—Nap Nap back run, block B, containing 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Nap Nap block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

10.—Nap Nap back run, block C, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Nap Nap, Block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

11.—Nap Nap back run, block D, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Nap Nap block C, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

12.—Toogoombie back run, block A, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Nap Nap, block D, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

13.—Toogoombie back run, block B, 35,200 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Toogoombie, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

14.—Pevensey back run, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Toogoombie, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north for $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north for 10 miles; and thence west by south $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

15.—Mungadingadal back run, 64,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Pevensey, back run, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 10 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 10 miles. N.B.—Very inferior country. No water.

16.—Eli Elwah back run, block A, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Mungadingadal, back run, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

17.—Eli Elwah back run, block B, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Eli Elwah, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

18.—Burrabogie back run, block A, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Eli Elwah, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north for 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

19.—Burrabogie back run, block B, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Burrabogie, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

20.—Mulberry-gang back run, block A, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Burrabogie, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for 5 miles; thence north for 10 miles; and thence west for 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

21.—Mulberry-gang back run, block B, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Mulberry-gang, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

22.—Singorambah back run, block A, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at a point 15 miles south from the Old Yard on the Murrumbidgee River (the boundary point between the Runs of Mulberry-gang and Singorambah,) and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

23.—Singorambah back run, block B, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Singorambah, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

24.—Singorambah back run, block C, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Singorambah, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

25.—Singorambah back run, block D, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Singorambah, block C, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

26.—Moulamein back run, block A, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the south-west terminus of the Nap Nap, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north for 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

27.—Moulamein back run, block B, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Moulamein, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

28.—Windouran back run, block A, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Moulamein, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east for $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

29.—Windouran back run, block B, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Windouran, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles, and thence west $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

30.—Coonargo back run, block A, 48,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of the Wirkenbergil Run, leased to Walter Ogilvie, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. N.B.—No water.

31.—Coonargo back run, block B, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Coonargo, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

32.—Coonargo back run, block C, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Coonargo, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

33.—Yanco back run, block A, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Coonargo, block C, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north for 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

34.—Yanco back run, block B, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Yanco, block A, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

35.—Yanco back run, block C, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Yanco, block B, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

36.—Yanco back run, block D, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Yanco, block C, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

37.—Yanco back run, block E, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Yanco, block D, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

38.—Yanco back run, block F, 32,000 acres.

Commencing at the north-east terminus of Yanco, block E, and extending south for 10 miles; thence east by north 5 miles; thence north 10 miles; and thence west by south 5 miles. N.B.—No water.

39.—The run known as Morundah, estimated to contain 32,000 acres.

Commencing at a marked tree on the east bank of the Columbo Creek, having the broad arrow on it, and extending for 10 miles in an easterly course, being the south boundary; on the west by a line running north, and bounded by the run of Mr. Howell, called Bingagong, for 5 miles; on the north by a line commencing at the terminus of the west line, and running in an easterly course for 10 miles; and on the east by a line running about south for 5 miles, and parallel to the western line, and equidistant 5 miles.

MARANOA.

1.—The Run called Boonangar North, estimated to contain 32,000 acres.

On the east by R. Pringle's western boundary; on the south by the McIntyre or Barwin River; on the west by a line running north from the junction of Gnowra Gnowra Creek with that river; and on the north by a line parallel to and 5 miles distant from the said river.

DARLING DOWNS.

2.—A run called Morromby, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Sandy Creek from the western boundary line of Monaghan's Creek Run, within 3 miles of the junction of Sandy Creek with Monaghan Creek; on the north and south by the ridges shedding their waters into Sandy Creek; on the west by unlocated lands consisting of sandy ridges.

3.—The run called Waar Waar, estimated to contain about 64,000 acres.

Commences at the western boundary of the Dunmore Run in the occupation of Mr. Robert Logan, and extends 10 miles (more or less) down the Jones' River to a marked tree $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles below the junction of the Waar Waar Creek; the run comprises the watershed of the Waar and Scrubby Creeks, and is bounded on the north by the ridges turning those waters; on the east by the Dunmore Run; on the south by the Jones' River; and on the west by a line north from the marked tree to the ridges aforesaid.

LIVERPOOL PLAINS.

4.—The run called Imbegar, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing from a marked tree on the Narran at the western end of a waterhole called Imbegar, and bounded on the west by a line south 5 miles; thence on the south by a line east 5 miles; thence on the east by a line north 5 miles to a marked tree on the Narran; on the north by the Narran.

5.—The run called Imbegar North, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Commencing from a marked tree on the north bank of the Narran, at the western end of a waterhole called Imbegar, and bounded on the west by a line north 5 miles; thence on the north by a line east 5 miles; thence on the east by a line south 5 miles to a marked tree on the Narran; on the south by the Narran.

6.—The run known as Billyeena, estimated to contain 31,360 acres.

Commencing at Mr. Onus's hut, and extending eastward 5 miles to a point to be determined; thence on the east by a line running north 7 miles, cutting Kaya-aye Creek and its tributaries; thence on the north by a line running west 7 miles; and thence on the west by a line running south 7 miles to a point which measurement will determine; and thence 2 miles eastward to Mr. Onus' but first mentioned.

7.—The run called Turree, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

This run is situated on the northern bank of the Barwin River, 3 miles below the junction of the Bree, a creek running into the Barwin 20 miles from Mohanah, Mr. Wm. Lawson's Station, and extends 5 miles down the said river; and is bounded on all sides by unoccupied waste lands.

BLIGH.

8.—The run called Black Stump, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Bounded by Coolah Range on the south; on the north by the road leading to the Big River and Mr. Lawson's Station; on the west by a marked line down the creek 5 miles; on the east by the Coolah Range as it extends to Vincent's boundary.

9.—Currundy, a block of land estimated to contain 16,000 acres, and bounded as follows, viz. :—

On the west by the Wammerama Creek; on the east by a marked tree line of 5 miles; on the north by a marked tree line of 5 miles; on the south by a marked tree line of 5 miles. There is no station adjacent.

10.—Ballagabar, a block of land estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Bounded on the east by Bimble, Reardon's run; on the south by Mr. Walker's run and boundary of his station called Conamable; on the west by Granger's marked tree line of the run called Toloon; on the north by the marked tree line of the Bundy run, Mr. N. S. Lawson's.

11.—The run called Mogemul, estimated to contain about 10,000 acres.

Bounded on the north by the run of Mr. Vincent, called Mumbedah; east and south by Mr. Lawson's Station Lagoons; and on the west by unavailable unoccupied country.

12.—The run known as Wingenbar, situated on the Merry Merry Creek, in the vicinity of the Castlereagh River, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Commencing at a large waterhole called Wingenbar; and extending up the creek on the right hand or (south-west) bank for the space of 5 miles, by a depth of 5 miles; and being about 12 miles below Tailby's sheep station, on the same creek.

13.—The run known as Mungabumbone, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

Bounded by the Merry Merry, 5 miles frontage; on the south-west side that is $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of the old hut, and $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of the old hut, 5 miles bearing east of the lower corner pin; then 5 miles south to the intended corner pin; then 5 miles west to the Merry Merry Creek to include the quantity. The land is scrubby, at the same time it is pretty well grassed in many places; part of an old hut is standing on the land.

WELLINGTON.

14.—The run called Burrimal, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the west side of the Mara Creek; at the lower boundary of C. W. Finch, lower run Willi on the same side of that creek, and bounded on the south by that boundary 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles; thence by an east line 5 miles to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek to the starting point.

15.—The run called Curra, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the west side of the Genarin Creek; commencing at the upper boundary of Mr. John Dargin's run, Genarin; and bounded by that creek upwards 5 miles; and on the other sides by east and west and north and south lines to include the quantity.

16.—The run called Bucka Bucka, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the east side of the Mara Creek; commencing at a point 15 miles (measured on a north line), below the lower boundary of C. W. Finch's run, Weeli, on same side of creek; and bounded on the south by an east line 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles; thence by a west line to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek to the starting point.

17.—The Stockyard Run, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the west side of Mara Creek; commencing at a point 15 miles (measured on a north line), below the lower boundary of the lower run tendered for by C. W. Finch; and bounded thence by a west line 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles, or to the back boundary of the runs on the Barwin, if that boundary be within 5 miles; thence by an east line, or by that boundary to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek upwards.

18.—The run called Bulgie, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the Back or Gennarin Creek; commencing at the upper boundary of the run tendered for by C. W. Finch, and bounded by that boundary 5 miles; and on the remaining sides by north and south and east and west lines, and the creek downwards to the starting point to include the quantity.

19.—The run called Hermitage West, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the west side of the Mara Creek; commencing at the lower boundary of the Waughandary run and bounded by that boundary 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles, or to the upper boundary of C. W. Finch's upper run Weeli, on same side of creek, should that boundary prove to be within 5 miles; thence by an east line to the Mara Creek; and thence by that creek to the starting point.

20.—The run known as Gennarin No. 1, estimated to contain 16,000 acres.

A block of land on the east or Bogan side of the Gennarin Creek; commencing opposite to the lower boundary of the Curra Run, and bounded thence by an east line 5 miles, or to the back boundary of the Bogan Runs, if that boundary be within 5 miles; thence by a south line, or that boundary, 5 miles; thence by a west line to the Gennarin Creek; and thence by that creek downwards to the starting point.

21.—The run called Willerie and Blowan, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Commencing on the west side of the Macquarie River, at the waterhole called Blowan, and bounded by that river upwards 5 miles; thence by a west line 5 miles; thence by a north line 5 miles; and thence by an east line 5 miles to the starting point.

22.—The run known as Tabathong, estimated to contain 15,500 acres.

Bounded on the north side by the Bogan River, being 18 miles lower down the river than a station now occupied by Mr. Andrew Kerr, and surrounded on the other sides by unlocated land; having a frontage of 5 miles to the said river, and extending 5 miles back from the said river.

MORUMBIDGEE.

23.—The run called Beago, estimated to contain 25 square miles.

Bounded on the south by Ondamaline (Mr. D. R. Gale's), and mountain ranges; on the east

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by Courabirah (Mr. G. Galvin's), and lofty mountains; on the north by Dutzon (Mr. F. Griffiths's); and on the west by Hoban (Mr. T. H. Bardwell's), and by lofty mountains.

24.—The run known as Augalong, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Bounded on the north by the licensed run of Toomaroona; on the south by unoccupied Crown Lands; on the west by the run of Quelama (or Cooleman); and on the east by unoccupied Crown Lands; watered by springs.

MANEROO.

25.—The run called Bidwell Swamp, estimated to contain about 16,000 acres.

Bounded on the west by the Spring Creek to its source, near the base of the Tebbut range; on the south by the continuation of that range to the Delegat River; on the east by the range that divides the waters falling into the Delegat River from those falling into the Little Plain River; and on the north by the latter mentioned range to Spring Creek. This description includes both banks of the Delegat River opposite to Bidwell Swamp.

26.—The run known as Bidi, estimated to contain 10,240 acres.

The Bidi Run which is situated on the east side of the Snowy River, is bounded on the south by a range called the Wall, which abuts on the Snowy River, nearly opposite the junction of the Pinch River; on the east by spurs of ranges; on the north by a range which abuts on the Snowy River, nearly opposite to the junction of Reedy Creek; and on the west by the Snowy River.

27.—The block of land known as Cobbon, situated in the County of Wallace, estimated to contain about 6,400 acres.

Bounded on the west by the Crackenback Range; on the north by a timbered range, commencing at an old sheep station hut, and thence to the Snowy River, being the southern boundary line of Mr. Richard Brook's station called Tindabine; on the east by the Snowy River to the junction of the Mowembah River; and on the south by the latter to the Crackenback Range.

28.—The run called Crow Valley, estimated to contain about 7,680 acres.

Bounded on the south-west by a range bearing south-easterly, commencing at the junction of the Crow Valley Creek with the Majongbella Creek, and terminating at the point where the bridle path leading to Balalaba crosses it; thence by a straight line bearing northerly to a bald hill on the Jerabagally Range; and thence by that range to the point at which the aforesaid bridle path crosses it; and on the north-west and west by a continuation of the same range to the junction of Crow Valley Creek with Majongbella Creek.

29.—Buckenderry, a block of land situated in the county of Wallace; estimated area 10,240 acres.

Bounded on the east by John Frazer's station; on the west and south-west by Thompson's (now McClure's) station; on the west and north-west by Lawley's and Driscoll's stations; and on the north by the southern boundary of Mr. Grahame's station of Frying Pan Creek, being a line commencing at the top of the range opposite the two water holes near the head of Eucombean Plain; and thence southerly to a marked tree, near a cluster of rocks, at John Frazer's eastern boundary.
