GENERAL CEMETERY.—MELBOURNE.

THE description of the following Grant of Land, which has been appropriated for a General Cemetery at Melbourne, is published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant will be executed in favor of the approved Trustees.

1. BOURKE, 27, Twenty-seven acres, parish of Jika Jika, commencing 1 mile north from a point on the northern boundary of the City of Melbourne, being east 7 chains from the Cattle Yards; and bounded on the south by a line bearing east 10 chains; on the east by a line bearing north 27 chains; on the north by a line bearing west 10 chains; and on the west by a line bearing south 27 chains.

Authorised as the site of a General Cemetery at Melbourne.
