**FERRY AT GRAFTON.**

**VARIATION OF THE MAGNETIC MERIDIAN AT PARRAMATTA, 9° 38' 52" EASTERLY.**

N.B.—The above is the result of observations made with the identical instrument that was employed by Mr. Rumken, at the Parramatta Observatory, during the month of April, 1823, when the variation was found to be 8° 47' 41" east, so that, in eighteen years the increase has amounted to 51' 11" or at the rate of 1° 49' 7" per annum.
