ROADS.

IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, having deemed it expedient to open and make a Parish Road, to be maintained at the expense of the Parishes through which it is to pass; commencing at the intersection of the old Point Piper Road with the old South Head Road, and continued in a southeasterly direction; and then south-westerly to the north-west corner of the Corporation fence enclosing the water reserve; it then runs along the north-west side of that fence in a south-westerly direction to the old Botany Road; it then crosses that road in the same direction, and passing over a range of sand hills enters the Lachlan Mills Estate; it then runs south-westerly to a low range of sand bills, which it crosses, then passes over a flat, bordering the Waterloo Swamp, and enters the Waterloo Estate; it then runs in a general south-westerly direction, bordering the swamp, crossing it and passing over a range of sand hills; it then enters a flat which it crosses, and passes over sand hills, at the foot of which it crosses an old road to Botany; and thence runs along a low strip of land having swamp on both sides, until it reaches the present road from Sydney to Mudbank at a point between two small bridges distant about 90 chains from the Waterloo Mills; Notice is hereby given, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council 4th William IV., No. 11, intituled, "An Act "for making, altering, and improving the Roads throughout the Colony of New South Wales, " and for opening and improving the Streets in "the Towns thereof," a survey or tracing, shewing the intended line of the said road, is now deposited in the Office of the Surveyor General in Sydney; and all persons interested therein, are requested to transmit in writing to the Clerk of the Executive Council, within one month from this date, any well grounded objection which may exist to the formation of the said Road.

A T the instance of the Government of Western Australia, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Notice, offering a bonus for the importation of Camels and Alpacas into that Colony.

CAMELS. ALPACAS.

His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, for the information of merchants and shipmasters, that the Colonial Government, being anxious to encourage the importation of the above animals, as likely to be useful to the settlers, will pay a bonus of sixty pounds to the first importer of one male and two female Camels in healthy condition; also a bonus of fifty pounds to the first importer of two male and eight female Alpacas in like healthy condition; provided the same be landed in this Colony within twelve months from this date. There can be little doubt but that these animals would be immediately purchased, at very remunerating prices to the importer, by the public.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-DITIONAL PARDON.
