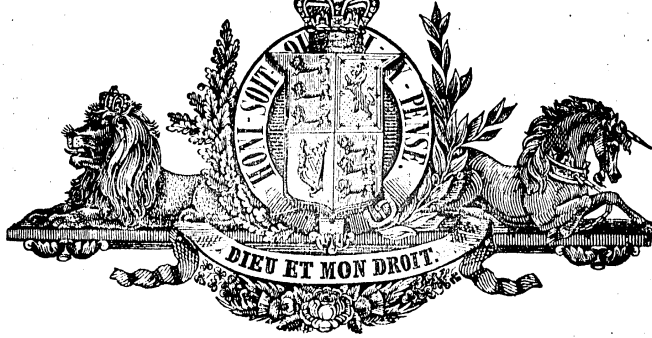

LEVEE.

ELECTORAL LISTS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR desires to draw the attention of the several Benches of Magistrates, Assessors, and other persons, who have any duty imposed upon them by the Electoral Act recently passed, to the proceedings necessary to be taken for preparing and revising the Lists of Electors for the several Electoral Districts of the Colony.

2. It may perhaps be proper to remind the different Benches, that Collectors for the preparation of the Electoral Lists are to be appointed not later than the first June next, and that the Lists are to be completed between the first and the twenty-eighth day of June in all Electoral Districts, except Corporate Towns, wherein they are to be prepared by the twenty-fifth of June.

CONDITIONAL PARDON.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that in conformity with the provisions of the Act of Parliament 6 Vict., cap 7, HER MAJESTY has been graciously pleased to authorise the issue of a Pardon to John Edwards, per "Henry Porcher" 2, on condition that, during the remainder of the term of his sentence, he does not return to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

QUIT RENTS.

UNDER the authority of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, and with the advice of the Executive Council, His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that on the expiration of the year ending on the 31st December next, all Quit Rents on Country Lands of higher annual amount than two shillings for each one hundred acres will be reduced to that uniform rate, provided that the holders of the lands shall have made the four annual payments, according to the rates fixed in their respective Grants, which will then have become due under the Regulation of the 9th of October 1846, and provided that the future Rents be punctually paid until the claim to them on the part of the Crown, shall have been extinguished by the completion of twenty annual payments, or by an equivalent payment in cash, according to the scale laid down in the said Regulation. It is to be understood that parties having made the four annual payments at the present rate, in the manner above directed, will be entitled to redeem at the reduced rate of two shillings per one hundred acres, the further payments necessary to complete twenty years rent, according to the scale set forth in the notice above referred to.

2. It is further notified, that the Quit Rents on allotments in Country Towns will be reduced to one fourth of the rates fixed in the Deeds of Grant, but in all other respects the same principle is to be applied to them as is laid down in this notice respecting Country lands.

CHURCH GRANTS, PORT PHILLIP DISTRICT.

THE descriptions of the following Grants of Land, which have been appropriated for the purposes hereinafter mentioned, are published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged or other cause of uncertainty appear, Deeds of Grant of the same will be executed in favor of the approved Trustees, viz. :—

42. GEELONG, 1, One acre, county of Grant, parish of Corio; commencing at the south-west corner of the junction of Gheringhap-street with Ryrie-street, and bounded on the north by the continuation westward of Ryrie-street, bearing north 79 degrees, west 4 chains 22 links; on the west by a line bearing south 11 degrees, west 2 chains 37½ links; on the south by a line bearing south 79 degrees, east 4 chains 22 links; and on the east by Gheringhap-street, bearing north 11 degrees, east 2 chains 37½ links.

Authorised as the site for an Independent Chapel.

43. NORTH GEELONG, 2r., Two roods, county of Grant, parish of Corio; commencing at a point north 1 chain 52 links from the north-west corner of the reserve for ornamental grounds, and bounded on the south by the continuation of the north side of Corio-street, bearing south 79 degrees, east 3 chains; on the east by a line bearing north 1 chain 68 links; on the north by a line bearing north 79 degrees, west 3 chains; and on the west by a road of 1 chain 50 links wide, bearing south 1 chain 68 links.

Authorised for the Church of England as the site for a School House.

47. NORTH GEELONG, 2r., Two roods, county of Grant, parish of Corio; bounded on the south by the continuation of the north side of Corio-street, bearing south 79 degrees, east 3 chains; on the east by a line bearing north 1 chain 68 links; on the north by a line bearing north 79 degrees, west 3 chains; and on the west by a line bearing south 1 chain 68 links.

Authorised for the Church of England as the site for a Clergyman's Residence.

48. GENERAL CEMETERY, BALLAN, 4, Four acres, county of Grant, parish unnamed, near Ballan, commencing at a point bearing from the south-west corner of the Village Reserve of Ballan, east 21 chains 80 links, and south 160 chains; and bounded on the east by a line bearing south 5 chains 72 links; on the south by a line bearing west 7 chains; on the west by a line bearing north 5 chains 72 links; and on the north by a line bearing east 7 chains.

PORTION FOR OTHER DENOMINATIONS, 1, One acre, near Ballan; bounded on the east by the portion appropriated as a Cemetery for the Church of England, containing 1 acre, being a line bearing south 2 chains 86 links; on the south by a line bearing west 3 chains 50 links; on the west by a line bearing north 2 chains 86 links; and on the north by the portion appropriated as a Cemetery for the Roman Catholic Church, containing 1 acre, being a line bearing east 3 chains 50 links.

**FIFTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CON-
DITIONAL PARDON.**
