#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ
Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain General and
Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New
South Wales and its Dependencies, and ViceAdmiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act for " regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, " Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns " respectively, and for removing and preventing " nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor of the said Colony for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any other Towns in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act, as amended by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to amend an Act for regulating the "Police, in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, " Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, " and for removing and preventing nuisances and " obstructions, and for the better alignment of "Streets therein," be extended to the Town of Ipswich, in the County of Stanley, parish of Ipswich, and that the following shall be deemed to be the boundaries of the said Town, for the purposes of the said first recited Act, that is to say, commencing at the north-west corner 55 links west from a gum tree marked on four sides, at the junction of Mohi Creek with the Bremer River; and bounded on part of the north by a line bearing east 71 chains 5 links to a stake on the Bremer River, bearing 118 degrees, and distant 21 links from a gum tree marked on four sides; on the remainder of the north by the north bank of the Bremer River downwards to a large gum tree marked on four sides; thence on the east by a line straight across the river, bearing south 42 degrees west to the termination on the opposite bank of the west side of a road in the eastern suburbs, and further by the southerly extension of said road 167 chains 60 links to a stake on the top of a modorately bold ridge, distant 28 links from a dead iron bark tree marked on four sides, bearing south 34 degrees 40 minutes east; on the south by a line bearing west 83 chains 65 links to a stake on Deebing Creek 30 links from a large gum tree marked on four sides at the junction of a small water course bearing south 22 degrees 30 minutes west; on the west by Deebing Creek downwards to its confluence with the Bremer River, and by that river downwards to the junction of Mohi Creek as aforesaid.

#### CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED LANDS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the preliminary proceedings necessary for the issue of leases for runs beyond the Settled Districts, being as yet for the most part incomplete, existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the license fee, according to the quantity of stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such run.

2 The Licenses must be taken out on or before

the 30th day of September next.

3. If, within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Government shall be in a position to grant leases of runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any licensee under this notice who may obtain a lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his license, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the license was granted.

4. It will be understood that the licenses to be renewed under this notice, are those for pastoral runs beyond the Settled Districts only. Leases of lands held for other than pastoral purposes, and of runs or parts of runs brought within the Settled Districts by the operation of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, are provided for by the Notice issued from this Office, on the 11th February last.

NDER the authority of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State, and with the advice of the Executive Council, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that on the expiration of the year ending on the 31st December next, all Quit Rents on Country Lands of higher annual amount than two shillings for each one hundred acres will be reduced to that uniform rate, provided that the holders of the lands shall have made the four annual payments, according to the rates fixed in their respective Grants, which will then have become due under the Regulation of the 9th of October 1846, and provided that the future Rents be punctually paid until the claim to them on the part of the Crown, shall have been extinguished by the completion of twenty annual payments, or by an equivalent payment in cash, according to the scale laid down in the said Regulation. It is to be understood, that parties having made the four annual payments at the present rate, in the manner above directed, will be entitled to redeem at the reduced rate of two shillings per one hundred acres, the further payments necessary to complete twenty years rent, according to the scale set forth in the notice above referred to.

2. It is further notified, that the Quit Rents on allotments in Country Towns will be reduced to one fourth of the rates fixed in the Deeds of Grant, but in all other respects the same principle is to be applied to them as is laid down in this notice res-

pecting Country lands.

#### ELECTORAL LISTS.

2. It may perhaps be proper to remind the different Benches, that Collectors for the preparation of the Electoral Lists are to be appointed not later than the first June next, and that the Lists are to be completed between the first and the twenty-eighth day of June in all Electoral Districts, except Corporate Towns, wherein they are to be prepared by the twenty-fifth of June.

- 3. It is required with a rough quarry dressing, and must be capable of squaring only, to the above specified dimensions; the price will be adjusted at per cubic foot; but no surplus measurement in the Blocks will be computed.
- 4. The Blocks are to be delivered at the Wharf on Cockatoo Island, where assistance will be afforded in landing them.
- 5. Tenders must state the period at which the Stone will be delivered, and a specimen, which need not exceed half a cubic foot in size, must accompany the Tender.

- For the supply and delivery of the Granite at Melbourne, ready for shipment.
- For its shipment and freight from Melbourne to Cockatoo Island; or, the whole may be included in one Tender.
