"PASSENGERS' ACT, 1849."

REFERRING to the Proclamation contained in the Supplementary *Government Gazette*, of the 24th December, 1849, issued by His Excellency the Governor for the purpose of determining the rule of computation by which the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from this Colony should be computed for the purposes of the "Passengers' Act, 1849," and for regulating certain other matters connected therewith, which Proclamation was by the terms of the Act subject to the Queen's confirmation or disallowance; His Excellency directs it to be notified, for general information, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has intimated in a Despatch dated the 23rd August, 1850, that Her Majesty has been pleased to approve of the said Proclamation.

TEN POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.
