" PASSENGERS' ACT, 1849."

EFERRING to the Proclamation contained in the Storelanders C. in the Supplementary Government Gazette, of the 24th December, 1849, issued by His Excellency the Governor for the purpose of determining the rule of computation by which the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from this Colony should be computed for the purposes of the " Passengers' Act, 1849," and for regulating certain other matters connected therewith, which Proclamation was by the terms of the Act subject to the Queen's confirmation or disallowance; His Excellency directs it to be notified, for general information, that the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, has intimated in a Despatch dated the 23rd August, 1850, that Her Majesty has been pleased to approve of the said Proclamation.

TEN POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDI-TIONAL PARDON.

HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the 27th ultimo, William Ashworth, a prisoner under sentence of seven years hard labor, effected his escape from the Lunatic Asylum, whither he had been removed from Darlinghurst Gaol; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of ten pounds will be paid to any free person who may within six months from the present date, give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and lodging in safe custody of that individual; or if the person giving such information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance to him of a Conditional Pardon.
