## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for the removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and for the better alignment of Streets therein*," it was amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, should deem it expedient to extend the said Act to any other Towns in the said Colony, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor or Acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby direct that the provisions of the said Act, as amended by a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council, passed in the eleventh year of Her said Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, Bathurst, and other Towns respectively, and for the removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions, and*

*for the better alignment of Streets therein*," be extended to the Town of Belfast, in the County of Villiers, and District of Port Phillip.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this thirty-first day of May, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, the Governor and Executive Council of the Colony are empowered, in certain cases therein named, to substitute a declaration in lieu of an oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit, which might, but for the passing of that Act, be required to be taken or made, which said declaration is to be made and subscribed before the Officer previously empowered to administer such oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit, notice is hereby given, that

His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, the Governor of the said Colony, and the said Executive Council, have been pleased, in pursuance of the said Act, to substitute, by an Order in Council, a declaration in lieu of oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit, required in the case, and in respect of the matters mentioned in the said Order, which is as follows, viz.:—

His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council, in pursuance of the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, 9 Victoria, No. 9, are pleased to direct, that in lieu of an oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit, which, but for the passing of the said Act would have been required, the following declaration shall be made by Commissioners, or other Officers appointed to protect the rights of the Crown, in the Gold Districts of the Colony, as to the correctness of the accounts to be rendered by them to the Government of monies, or of Gold in lieu thereof, which have been or shall be received by them in their Official capacity, and of their disposal thereof:—

"I, \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly and sincerely declare, that, (here insert the particulars required;) and I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true, and by virtue of the provisions of an Act made and passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, 'An Act for the more effectual abolition of oaths and affirmations taken and made in various Departments of the Government of New South Wales, and to substitute declarations in lieu thereof, and for the suppression of voluntary and extra-judicial oaths and affidavits.'"

And it is further ordered, that under the provisions of the said Act, the officer or person empowered to administer such declaration shall be the same as before whom the oath, solemn affirmation, or affidavit for which it is substituted might have been taken.

CONTRACT FOR GRANITE OR BLUE  
STONE FROM PORT PHILLIP.

**T**ENDERS will be received at this Office, until 12 o'clock of Tuesday, the 24th June next, from persons desirous of supplying the undermentioned Blocks of Granite from Port Phillip, for the public works on Cockatoo Island, viz.:—

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 3 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Twenty-five Blocks of Granite, each 2 feet by 2 feet by 4 feet.

Sixty Blocks of Granite, each 6 feet by 2 feet by 3 feet.

2. The Stone must be of the best quality procurable, free from flaw, shake, or crack, and will be subject to the approval of the Civil Engineer at Sydney, or such other person as may be appointed.

3. It is required with a rough quarry dressing, and must be capable of squaring only, to the above specified dimensions; the price will be adjusted at per cubic foot; but no surplus measurement in the Blocks will be computed.

4. The Blocks are to be delivered at the Wharf on Cockatoo Island, where assistance will be afforded in landing them.

5. Tenders must state the period to which the Stone will be delivered, and a specimen, which need not exceed half a cubic foot in size, must accompany the Tender.

6. Separate Tenders will be received—

For the supply and delivery of the Granite at Melbourne, ready for shipment.

For its shipment and freight from Melbourne to Cockatoo Island; or, the whole may be included in one Tender.

7. Further particulars respecting the Contract may be obtained on application to the Civil Engineer, Sydney.

8. Separate Tenders will also be received for the supply of Blue Stone procurable in the neighbourhood of Melbourne, in the same quantities and dimensions, and under the same conditions, as the Granite is to be tendered for; but it must be understood, that in the event of an offer for either the Granite or Blue Stone being accepted, the supply of the other description will not be required.

9. At the foot of every Tender there must be a memorandum signed by the party tendering and two responsible persons as sureties, agreeing to be responsible for the due performance of the Contract, in the event of the Tender being accepted, and undertaking, in that event, that they will severally execute and deliver at the Office of the Civil Crown Solicitor, within seven days from the date of the usual notification of acceptance of such Tender, a Bond to Her Majesty in the penal sum of £300 for securing such performance, otherwise the Tender will not be taken into consideration.
