#### PROCLAMATION.

Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New
South Wales and its Dependencies, and ViceAdmiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

In pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An "Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land "belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colo-"nies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at Eleven o'clock of Wednesday, the ninth day of July next, the following Portions of Crown Land will be offered for sale by public auction, at the Police Office, Ipswich, Moreton Bay, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions and under the provisions of the above recited Act.
