CROWN LANDS BEYOND THE SETTLED LANDS.

(RENEWAL OF PASTURAGE LICENSES.)

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified for general information, that the preliminary proceedings necessary for the issue of leases for runs beyond the Settled Districts, being as yet for the most part incomplete, existing Licenses for the occupation of Crown Lands so situated, will be renewed on the 1st July next, on the same terms as licenses have been granted for the now current year, subject of course to the adjustment of the license fee, according to the quantity of stock returned by the Commissioner as pastured on every such run.

2. The Licenses must be taken out on or before the 30th day of September next.

3. If, within the year commencing on 1st July next, the Government shall be in a position to grant leases of runs under Her Majesty's Order in Council, any licensee under this notice who may obtain a lease, will receive credit in the payment of his first year's rent, for so much of the amount paid for his license, as may be proportionate to the unexpired part of the term for which the license was granted.

4. It will be understood that the licenses to be renewed under this notice, are those for pastoral runs beyond the Settled Districts only. Leases of land held for other than pastoral purposes, and of runs or parts of runs brought within the Settled Districts by the operation of Her Majesty's Order in Council of 9th March, 1847, are provided for by the Notice issued from this Office, on the 11th February last.

## POSTAGE BETWEEN NEW SOUTH WALES AND VICTORIA.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR-GENERAL, having conferred with His Honor the Superintendent of Port Phillip, relative to the Postage which will become chargeable on letters, packets, and newspapers, passing between this Colony and Victoria, on the erection of the latter into a separate Dependency of the Crown, has been pleased to direct, that, pending the necessary legislation on the subject, the same charges for Postage shall continue to be made as at present on all such letters, packets, and newspapers; but it being necessary to make such arrangements, in reference to this matter, as will ensure to each Colony, so far as circumstances will permit, the benefit of its postal Revenue, it is to be understood, that the Postage Stamps of each Colony will only be available in posting letters, packets, or newspapers in the Colony in which they are issued; but they will, nevertheless, if of sufficient value, free them from further charge on delivery in the other Colony to which they may be conveyed. If not pre-paid by money or in stamps, they will nevertheless be forwarded to their destination, and in such case they will become chargeable (newspapers excepted) with double postage in the Colony in which they may be delivered. If the value of the stamps be insufficient, the difference necessary to make up the proper amount of postage, will also be charged double on delivery of the letters and packets. The amount received for postage on letters, packets, and newspapers not pre-paid will be carried to the credit of the revenue of the Colony in which the same is collected.
