PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the present year of Her Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for taking an account of the population of New South Wales,*" it was enacted, that with respect to any portion of the Territory of New South Wales, not included within any one of the Police Districts, or Commissioners' Districts, as therein before mentioned, it should be lawful, for His Excellency the Governor by Proclamation, to be by him for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to declare within what Police District or Commissioners' District, such portion of Territory should, for the purposes of the said Act, be comprised: Now, therefore, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, in virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the portion of Territory which is situate between the Police Districts of Macleay River and Port Macquarie, (as notified on the 17th January, 1850,) embracing the north-eastern portion of the County of Macquarie, and bounded on the north by the Macleay River from its mouth to the first section line west of the eastern boundary of the parish of Kalateence, on the west by that section line southerly to the southern branch of the Maria River, and by that branch to its head in the range heading Maria's and Wilson's Rivers, on the south by a line bearing east to Crescent Head, and on the east by the sea coast to the mouth of the Macleay River aforesaid, shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be comprised within the Police District of Port Macquarie; and that the portion of Territory which is situate between the Darling and the South Australian Frontier, and is bounded on the west by a line due north from "Chowella," Fowler's Station, on the River

Murray, being the approximation to the 141st Meridian of east longitude, to the 30th parallel of south latitude, on the north by that parallel easterly to the River Darling, on the east by that river, and on the south by the River Murray to "Chowella" aforesaid, shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be comprised within the Commissioner's District of the Lower Darling.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, in New South Wales aforesaid, this eighteenth day of January, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and in the fourteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

COTTON.

(PREMIUM FOR CULTIVATION.)

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that, with a view to encourage the cultivation of Cotton in New South Wales, the following sums have been voted by the Legislative Council to be given as premiums for the best samples of that article grown in any part of the Colony, and exhibited in Sydney, on or before the 1st of June, 1851, viz. :—

- 1st.—For the best sample of Cotton Wool, weighing not less than 50lbs. £30
- 2nd.—For the second best sample, weighing not less than 50lbs £20

The particular qualities required are length, strength, fineness, and silkiness of staple, and brightness of color.

Proof will be required that the Cotton Wool exhibited is the produce of the Colony, by the certificate of a Magistrate, or of some other known person of respectability.

The samples are to be delivered at the Colonial Store at Sydney, and the awards will be made by a Board appointed by the Governor.

CROWN LANDS WITHIN THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

(ILLEGAL CULTIVATION AND SUB-LETTING.)

IT having been represented to the Government, that some of the Lessees of Crown Lands within the Settled Districts have, contrary to the conditions of their Leases and to the Regulations of the 29th March, 1848, either themselves cultivated or sub-let to others for the purpose of cultivation, portions of the lands so held by them: His Excellency the Governor, in order to put a stop to so serious an infraction of the 8th and 9th sections of the Regulations in question, and to prevent the unfair competition to which the holders of land in fee simple are thereby exposed, has been pleased to direct, that in every case in which it shall appear that any portion of such leased land has been brought into cultivation, notice shall be immediately given to the Lessee of the termination of his lease, in order that the land may be forthwith divided into suitable allotments and put up to sale by public auction, according to the Regulations.

ROADS AND BRIDGES BEYOND THE SETTLED DISTRICTS.

THE sum of One thousand five hundred pounds having been provided by the Legislative Council "for the formation of Roads and Bridges beyond the Settled Districts" of the Sydney or Middle District of the Colony, during the year 1851; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that applications for the formation of such roads and bridges, so far as provided for by the above amount, should, on or before the 1st February next, be submitted for the consideration of the Government, through the Magistrates of the District willing to superintend the execution of the work, with the assistance of other gentlemen in the neighbourhood.
