## QUARANTINE.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Melbourne, December 26, 1851.

CASES of Small Pox, Measles, and Dysentery, having occurred on board the ship Eagle, throughout her passage from England to this Port, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, under the authority vested in him by the provisions of the Acts 3 William 4th No. 1, and 5th Victoria No. 12 of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, has deemed it necessary to place the vessel, crew, and passengers, under Quarantine, of which all persons are hereby required to take notice accordingly.

The boundaries of the Quarantine Station, Hobson's Bay, are specified

in a Proclamation of this day's date.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies.

In accordance with the provisions of the Acts of the Governor and Council of New South Wales 3 William IV. No. 1, and 5th Victoria No. 12, I by this Proclamation declare and order that the Quarantine Ground in Hobson's Bay, shall be the portion of the said Harbour commencing at a point two miles distant from the south end of St. Kilda, and bearing W. by S. from it; from thence extending for two miles in a southerly direction; at the same distance from and parallel to the Beach, leading to Brighton, with an uniform width of one mile and a half. And I do hereby strictly prohibit all persons, not being themselves under Quarantine, or duly authorised, for the purposes of nesessary communication with vessels under Quarantine, or the Quarantine Ground, from going, under any pretence whatever, within the limits hereinbefore described in Hobson's Bay, when any ship or vessel is performing Quarantine in Hobson's Bay, or any persons, goods, wares, or merchandise, are undergoing Quarantine within the said limits, under the pains and penalties prescribed by law.
