# PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS. Her Majesty has been graciously pleased, by a Commission under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, the thirty-first day

of December, in the year of Our Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty, to constitute and appoint Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, to be Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief, in, and over the Colony of Victoria.

And whereas, Her said Majesty has also been further pleased, by a Commission under Her Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date at Windsor, the thirty-first day of December, in the year of Our Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty, to constitute and appoint me, Charles Joseph La Trobe, Esquire, Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony of Victoria, and its Dependencies; and in case of death, or during the absence of the said Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the said Colony and its Dependencies, for the time being, to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in the said Commission to the said Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief.

Now I the Licutenant Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have this day taken the prescribed oaths before William Foster Stawell, Esquire, Her Majesty's Principal Law Officer of the Colony of Victoria, for the time being, and the senior member for the time being of Her Majesty's Executive Council of the said Colony, and that I have accordingly assumed the said office of Lieutenant Governor. And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that Her Majesty has been pleased to nominate and appoint the undermentioned Officers to be Members of the Executive Council of the said Colony of Victoria: - that is to say: -

The Crown Prosecutor, or the principal Law Officer of the Crown for the said Colony, for the time being.

The Sub-Treasurer or Treasurer of the said Colony for the time being.

The Collector of Customs or the Principal Officer of Customs in the said Colony for the time being.

# OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor directs that until further notice the following Rules are to be invariably observed in conducting

official correspondence in this Colony.

1. Letters having reference to patronage, or applications for employment in the Colonial service, are to be addressed to His Excellency's private Secretary.

2. All other correspondence of a public nature is to be carried on through the Colonial Secre-

tary.
3. Subordinate Officers and others of a department are not to address themselves directly to the Colonial Secretary, but are to make there communications through the head of the Department, who in forwarding them will add any observations he may consider necessary to illuei-

date the subject.
4, Each Letter must be confined to a single

subject.

5. Letters are to be written in a distinct hand, on foolscap paper of a uniform size, and in order to reduce the expense of postage as much as possible, ordinary letters should be written on half sheet of foolscap with a quarter margin and in as compact a form as to closeness of lines as distinctness will allow, where the subject is of more than ordinary importance, requiring perhaps reference to other correspondence, or Departments, the

inner margin must be half the width of thepage but still written in a compact form.

6. Each Department is to number its letters in succession commencing annually with a fresh series, and if any Department has much correspondence with two or more others, it should have a separate series of numbering for each of them.

7. Letters are to be divided into distinct paragraphs according to the several points, or heads of the subject, and each paragraph is to be numbered for the greater facility of reference.

8. If a letter consists of two or more sheets, the pages should be numbered.

9. In replying to a letter, the date and number of the letter replied to should be given.

10. Where enclosures are necessary, they must be written on paper of a uniform size with the letter, and in as compact a form as possible.

11. The paragraphs of enclosures must also be numbered, and if consisting of more than two

sheets, should be likewise paged.

12. Whenever a minute can be made upon a letter referred for further information, this course is to be adopted instead of adding another letter to it.

13. Whenever large packages of returns, &c, exceeding the weight of sixteen ounces, can be sofely sent by any public conveyance, as by a steam boot or mail cart, at a less cost than if sent by the post, such mode of transit must be adopted: this rule, [however, will principally relate to Departments in Melbourne.]

14. All letters previously to being posted are

to have the proper number of postage stamps attached to them, and when stamps cannot be procured the postage must be prepaid; the amount of postage will be generally ascertained by weighing the letter, but it may be stated as a guide, that half a sheet of foolscap with an ordinary enve-lope weighs under half an ounce, and the postage is consequently two pence, the postage for three half sheets and envelope four pence, for seven half sheets and envelope eight pence.

15. Postage stamps are to be invariably used

whenever it is possible to procure them, in pre-ference to a pre-payment of postage.

16. Heads of Departments in Melbourne, will obtain their stamps from the Postmaster General, and in the country districts, from the several country Postmasters, who will be instructed to keep a supply, requisitions being made for the


number required upon such form as the Post-

master General may point out.

The Heads of the respective Departments are held severally responsible for the economical, and proper issue and employment of the stamps they receive, and a book or form appended will be kept, in which will be entered on one side the number procured, with the date of receipt, and on the other a daily entry of all letters dispatched, with the number of each class of stamps attached with the number of each class of stamps attached to them. At the end of the month this return will be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, signed by the Head of the Department, and the clerk who keeps the book.

Besides the memory of an integrity and an ability, of which we have had such ample proof of the kindness and courtesy universally experienced by us, during many years of official and private intercourse have taught us to feel, if we may be allowed to say so, a personal regard and esteem for your Excellency, which we think we may confidently predict no coming events can obliterate.

Trusting that this expression of our sentiments may not be deemed unacceptable to your Excellency, and tendering to you our warmest wishes for your success and welfare, in your new and arduous sphere of duties, we beg to subscribe ourselves.

# His Excellency's reply:-

Gentlemen .-

I return my hearty acknowledgments for this address of congratulation, which you are pleased to offer upon my assuming the authority and duties of Lieutenant Governor of the Colony of Victoria, after a service of nearly twelve years as Superintendent of the same province under a different appellation.

I am well assured of your attachment, both as individuals and as a body, to our Most Gracious

Sovereign's person and throne.

I thank you for the kind and complimentary terms in which you make allusion to my past service, and to the connexion which has hitherto existed between us, as well as to your friendly anticipation for the future,—reciprocating most unaffectedly your expressions of good-will and attachment.

It has always been a source of pride and satisfaction to me, that whatever degree of credit has been awarded to the Superintendent for steady and good government of the Port Phillip District during the past period, under very peculiar and somewhat anomalous circumstances, that credit could be shared in full measure by the great majority of public officers who have been associated with him. I have always esteemed their honor as my own, and there are very few instances in which my intimate acquaintance with the personal character and official conduct of my coadjutors, did not justify my unhesitatingly asserting, that if difficulties or disorder arose, it could be in no wise justly attributed to want of zeal, ability, or devotion to the public service. The future is in the hand of God; but I trust that no circumstances whatever may arise to weaken on either side the feeling of personal interest and esteem, which I am so happy at this time to share with you.

May it please your Excellency,-

We, the Bishop of Melbourne and Clergy of the

United Church of England and Ireland in this Diocese, beg respectfully to present to your Excellency our heartfelt congratulations on your appointment to your high position as Lieutenant Governor of Victoria.

It is not our province to enter on political events, nor is it necessary for us to do so. The Colony which has grown up under your firm and judicious rule, and which without mineral wealth, or external patronage, has by the Divine blessing on the energies of a free people advanced with a rapidity unexampled in the previous history of the world, is your best witness and your enduring monument; and we feel that we may as Citizens express our thankfulness, that he who has watched our Colony in its feeble infancy, and guided its unsteady childhood, has been selected by our beloved Sovereign to govern its early, but we hope, not precocious maturity.

But we have higher grounds for thankfulness than these. In a young country like this, it is a peculiar blessing that religion should be exemplified in the person of the Governor, and to the reverence for Divine things and spotless morals which have adorned your Excellency, may we think in a great measure be traced the high tone of religious and moral principle which distinguishes Victoria from other communities where a mixed population has suddenly grown into wealth and commercial activity. We cannot forget that the last hours of your superintendence of Port Phillip were spent as Chairman of a Missionary meeting for sending the Gospel to the Aborigines of this land, and the enthusiastic reception you met with from the multitude assembled there, proves that the good of all sects and parties appreciate your virtues and revere your character.

That God may preserve your Excellency long

to rule over us, and may grant to your Govern-ment even greater blessings than those which at-tended your administration, when both you and we were in a subordinate position, and that your Excellency and your honored lady, Mrs. La Trobe, may enjoy in private life the fulness of sanctified domestic happiness, and may be partakers of the life promised to all who love our Lord Jesus

That I have been enabled in the plain dis-charge of official and social duty, to aid in carrying His designs with this colony and people, and perhaps to strengthen the hands of those who are specially called to impress upon the minds of all, the truth, that no country can become really great and prosperous, without reverence to God and obedience to His Laws, is a matter of unfeigned thankfulness to me.

Allow me still to return you my best thanks for the terms in which you have expressed your good wishes for my future administration of the Government of the colony, now more directly committed to my charge; and for the manner in which you include Mrs La Trobe in your prayers and aspirations kind.
